A DEEPER DIVE...

7. As we wrap up this session of Connection Groups, review Nehemiah 1–6 and consider the entire story up to this point. He has had to deal with potential invasions, famine, dissention between the people, personal attacks and even threats to his life! But now the wall is completed with the help of God. What aspect of this story resonated the most with you? Was there a specific point throughout this session that changed - or challenged—your perspective on life?
