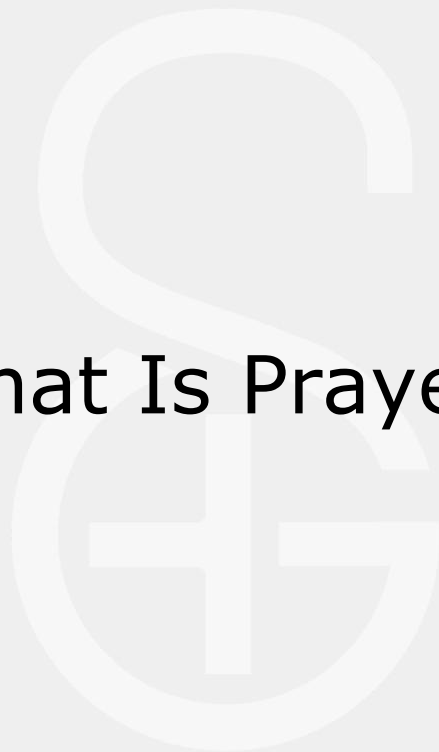
Pray for One Another

James 5:13-18

13 Is anyone among you suffering? Let him **pray**.
Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing **praise**. **14** Is
anyone among you sick? Let him call for the
elders of the church, and let them **pray** over him,
anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. **15**
And the **prayer** of faith will save the one who is
sick, and the Lord will raise him up. And if he has
committed sins, he will be forgiven.

16 Therefore, confess your sins to one another and **pray** for one another, that you may be healed. The **prayer** of a righteous person has great power as it is working. **17** Elijah was a man with a nature like ours, and he **prayed** fervently that it might not rain, and for three years and six months it did not rain on the earth. **18** Then he **prayed** again, and heaven gave rain, and the earth bore its fruit.

“If I had cherished iniquity in my heart, the Lord would not have listened.” Psalm 66:18

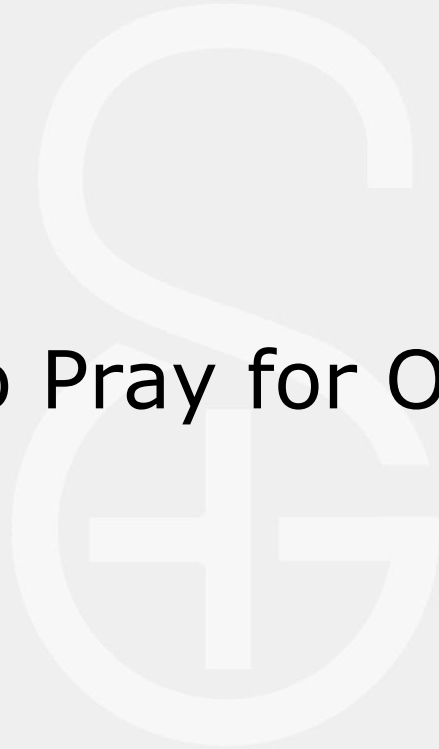
