²The word "catholic" means simply "universal." It does not refer to any specific church, but to the fact that the church is worldwide (Revelation 7:9-10).

Because of its importance, we ask you to consider carefully the following: Have you been baptized in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit? Have you publicly declared your repentance and faith in Jesus Christ? Are you trusting Jesus Christ alone for your only hope of forgiveness and eternal life? If you can say "yes" to these questions, we welcome you to the Lord's Table. If you are unclear or must say "no," then we ask you to abstain today.
