CPC has now built our first building at 4843 Williams Drive in Georgetown! Two years ago, the congregation began a "Generosity Initiative" to express our worship and thanksgiving toward the Lord for his work in our lives and to contribute special gifts toward construction and ownership of this building. Our goal is not simply to own the building, but rather to use the facility to enhance our ministry of God's Word to ourselves and to welcome and minister to others. This Generosity Initiative resulted in special gift pledges of \$1.8 million and ultimately construction of the building we are now using. CPC KIDS (Preschool - Grade 5)

Elementary Sunday School The Ist-5th graders will be embarking on a two-year, through the Bible endeavor this fall! God's story is the most beautiful story ever told, full of wonder and grace. There is nothing more important for the younger generation than imparting to them a rich vision of the gospel. Based on the bestselling Biggest Story Bible Storybook by Pastor Kevin DeYoung, teachers will lead kids through key Bible stories from Genesis to Revelation. This Sunday School class will help children understand God's plan to redeem the world through Jesus.

Children's Worship During the main service, children ages 3-5 are introduced to God's big plan of salvation in Jesus Christ as they learn key Bible stories in "The Gospel Story" by Marty Machowski. In each lesson teachers will be bringing Christ to preschoolers with the help of a lesson snapshot and simple object lessons that help children learn more about the gospel thread woven throughout all of Scripture.

ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL

Adult Sunday school begins at 915a each Sunday beginning September 10. All CPC members and regular attendees are encouraged to participate. It is greatly important for God's people to be immersed in his Word repeatedly and often. This regular exposure places God's Word in our minds and hearts, ready for the Holy Spirit to teach and convict us.

This fall, CPC will offer two adult Sunday school classes. Please join the class of your choice.

The Person and Work of the Holy Spirit Led by Daniel McDowell. Join us as we explore the Spirit's Being, the Spirit's Coming, the Spirit's Work in the church and the believer, and the Spirit and the Trinity. While theological in nature, this class will also include practical implications for today as well as question and answer time.

The last 5 weeks of the semester will be led by Jonathan Wells and will discuss the meaning and conditions of growing in the grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ. Over these 5 weeks, the class will focus on being planted in the right place, becoming rooted in the Word of God, growing up to stability in Christ, maturity and vitality through the Holy Spirit, and fruitfulness as the outcome of growth in Christ.
