Now the Lord said to Abram, "Go forth from your country, and from your relatives and from your father's house, to the land which I will show you..." - Genesis 12:1 (NASB95)

Session Report



The Session met on May 9th together with the Deacons. The meeting opened with prayer and an exhortation from Scripture by Pastor Quillen. Those present divided into groups to pray for their respective flocks. Afterwards, financial and property matters were discussed. In particular, thanks were given to the Deacons and Jack Matsinger for the new storage cabinets installed in the Sunday School classrooms.

The Session and Deacons separated and the Session continued their review of the church membership rolls. On Sunday, May 22nd, there will be 10 new members received. It was noted that Pat Zarella went home to glory on Sunday, May 8. She was a faithful and active member of Crossroads for more than 50 years before moving to Texas a few years ago. The Session will continue to pray for her sister Marge and other members of her family.

The Session met with Traci Burks representing the Nursery Committee. After reporting on a number of things that had been accomplished in the past year, she noted that the biggest challenge was scheduling adequate numbers of nursery workers to cover both services and Sunday School. Some workers have proven not to be dependable, failing to show up for their designated turn while others who have served for years have become tired, often due to having to cover for those who fail to

show up, and have asked to be removed from the schedule. The Session thanked Traci for her commitment to this key ministry and agreed that they would seek to encourage church members to participate. This would include focusing on the parents of young children in the nursery; those who have served in the past; and church officers and their wives. By increasing the number of workers, the ministry will be strengthened and the work more equitably allocated.

The Session also met with Brook Batzel regarding the Pioneer Clubs Ministry. Due to changes in her work schedule as well as commencing the homeschooling of her children, Brook had informed the Session that, while continuing to be involved in the ministry, she would not be able to organize and administrate it in the fall. Although she has been looking for a suitable replacement, to date she has not found anyone and none of the existing Pioneer staff is prepared to take on this responsibility. Brook reviewed a number of items with the Session regarding the ministry. The Session thanked Brook for her faithful service to the church's children and discussed approaching individuals who had benefited from Pioneers in the past to determine if they might be interested in participating in this important ministry.

Peacons Update



In this segment of the newsletter we will talk about the work of the Deacons. We will touch on projects that have been completed, projects that are on going, and future projects.

- Cabinets were purchased and installed in the Sunday School classrooms.
- The spotlight over the platform in the sanctuary was replaced.
- The problem of water seeping into the oil tank through the spout in the driveway was corrected and the driveway repaved. Problems with the heater caused by the water seepage were corrected.
- The projector in the sanctuary will be installed on the ceiling to provide more efficient operation.
 The ceiling bracket has been installed; the projector will be mounted and connected to the presentation computer.

The Deacons maintain a list of projects that need to be done. They are being completed in the order of importance, or as the funds become available.

Ongoing support by the Deacons includes a monthly gift to Amnion for their important ministry, and operation of a monthly "Deacons Table", providing food for families in need. Due to a lack of volunteers to support the purchase and distribution of food, the Deacons are currently distributing gift cards. We would like to go back to the purchase and distribution of fresh food – if you're interested in helping, please let us know.

In upcoming months we will discuss the proceedings of the monthly Deacons' meetings, and provide more information on the physical maintenance of the church building, manse, and Centennial House.

Missions Highlight



To Go on a Mission

In Genesis 12:1, God commanded Abraham to **go** to the land which God showed to him and in Mathew 28:19, Jesus asked His disciples to **go** and make disciples...! In both of these situations we feel some uncertainties but God follows with a promise; I will bless you and I will be with you. But that applies only after obedience to the call. If you go...!

If you were in Abraham's place, how would you respond? If you were one of the apostles, how would you take that command to go?

Going to a new place or going into an uncertain situation are always difficult from a human perspective. How about going to a place where you know the trauma and challenges ahead? The risk may be the same, but obedience makes the difference. It is a matter of trust. Faith and action go together in this process. Our forefathers of faith did the same. Whether it is near or far, the challenge is the same. God calls us every day to go on His mission. It may be in the streets of our neighborhood, or in far places but the question is - Are we ready to obey that call?

On May 30th Pastor Shibu and Mary are going to India on a three-month mission trip. There are known and unknown challenges for their trip but they trust in the Person who called them. During this trip they will be traveling to various places as part of their ministry, spending most of the time in Dehradun with India Village Mission in the Northern part of India. Later in July, a few members of Crossroads will be joining them in India on a short-term mission trip to work with India Village Mission.



INDIA VILLAGE MISSION (IVM) is a non-profit, Public Religious Charitable Trust, registered in the city of Dehradun in the State of Uttarakhand, India. Shibu started the Mission when he was a seminary student. He was challenged to do something that would impact the lives of people for good, which would also afford opportunities to share God's love to those in need.

Today IVM's activities consist of work among the underprivileged and marginalized slum dwellers in three different places. They have two tailoring centers and three informal education centers (where children are provided free tuition), with presently about 80 children benefiting daily from the program. Some of them also learn at the tailoring centers. They have a Sunday School where about 30 children attend regularly. They also reach out to parents of slum children and give Spiritual counseling and occasional medical camps for the people. Five full time staff works with them to meet the needs of the mission.

Pastor Shibu and Mary would appreciate your earnest prayers for safety, provisions, divine appointments, and fruitful witnessing during their trip.

Among other items, the Session agreed to make the church available to host the 2017 EE Day in light of the overwhelming success of this year's April 23, 2016 EE Day at Crossroads which brought more than 150 participants from a hundred mile radius representing dozens of churches. Many of these individuals contributed to Crossroads' mission to meet people at the crossroads of life with the gospel of Jesus Christ by going

into the surrounding neighborhood to share the good news. Those who participated agreed that it was a powerful day in the life of our church.

The Session also reviewed the Winter Series, which everyone agreed was a blessing, and made tentative plans for the Elder Planning Day in the fall. The meeting closed with prayer for the matters discussed and for the congregation.

Contributing over 30 youth and volunteers, Crossroads teamed up with fellow PCA churches Springton Lake, Christ the King, and Proclamation in this year's "Ultimate Retreat (UR)" youth retreat. A total of over 100 youth travelled to North Bay, Maryland for several days of teaching, worship, team-building activities, and fellowship. From rope courses and giant swings to paddleboats and various team competitions, not even youthful energy was a match for the demands of the retreat.

Pastor Tommy Keene of Christ the King (PCA) in Conshohocken was this year's plenary speaker. The topic: Big questions. In his sessions he spoke regarding the "big questions" many youth have. For example, why do evil and suffering exist? Or why is it important to be part of a local church? The youth also had opportunity to ask questions to a panel consisting of four leaders (including Zack Groff and Brandon Burks).


