Session Report



The Session met on May 8th. The meeting opened with prayer and an exhortation from Pastor Quillen. The Elders prayed for individual members of their respective flocks with a particular focus on those with physical needs and those with relatives needing the gospel. They also prayed for Pastor Oommen who was attending a conference in Ohio.

After prayer and discussion, the Session addressed several matters including officer nominations and training as well as the young adults. They also discussed various Presbytery matters and the changes taking place among the Teaching Elders of several sister churches. After reviewing the financial summary for April, they noted with thanks that, although the current expenses were still in excess of income, the giving for the Current, Missions, Deacons, Building, and Lacy Funds were ahead of last year.

The Session reviewed and discussed the Life Explored Winter Series. While the overall feedback from the participants was positive, the clear consensus was that the video portion of this particular series was inferior to those from the past. It was agreed that for 2018 a different curriculum would be used.

Those who participated in the E. E. Day on May 6th gave a good report that the event was well attended and all of the financial needs had been fully met. The overall organization was even better than last year. Outreach in the neighborhoods around the church was positive; however, the colder than usual weather did limit the number of available prospects since fewer people were outside than in 2016. There were dozens of gospel presentations, at least ten professions of faith and more than one hundred twenty attendees as well as several prospects to be followed up. Some of those reached on Saturday came to church the following day.

The Elders reviewed the progress on the preschool's transition to Crossroads. Pastor Quillen summarized the result of his visit along with Elder Reese to Alden Union's preschool earlier that day and gave an update from the Preschool Launch Committee. The construction and painting projects are making progress and should be completed by the end of the month. The preschool will have their closing ceremony on May 19th and plan to move the last week of the month. Volunteers would be needed to help from May 22 to May 27.

The Session reviewed the preaching schedule for the summer and noted that Crossroads in the Summer will begin on Sunday evenings. The Elders closed their meeting in prayer and asked the Lord for His continued guidance and direction and prayed particularly for the Deacons who will be meeting later in the month and for those reached with the gospel on Saturday that the Holy Spirit would continue to draw them to Christ.



Fundamentals of Reformed Theology



The Five Solas

The Protestant Reformation began 500 years ago, but its principles must not be lost to the ages. In every generation, the church is engaged in a battle for truth. Spiritual drift and worldly desire tempt God's people to compromise the gospel. Human pride and selfish ambition call for a man-centered salvation. If believers do not constantly contend for the core doctrines of the Christian faith, error will enter with its destructive consequences. Therefore, the church must always be reforming and seeking to recover the truths that are so easily set aside. Represented in five basic principles, the solas of the Reformation provide a solid outline of the core truths of Biblical faith. If we keep them close to heart, they serve as an anchor in an ever-shifting world.



1. Sola Scriptura (Scripture Alone)

Scripture alone serves as the authority for a believer's faith and practice. The pages of the Bible are nothing less than God's inerrant word, revealing both the state of man and the mind of God. It proclaims the way of salvation and the purpose of life. (2 Timothy 3:16-17, Jude 1-3, Acts 17:11, Hebrews 4:12)

2. Sola Christus (Christ Alone)

Jesus Christ has accomplished everything needed for the salvation of sinners. By His perfect life, righteousness has been earned. By His sacrificial death, forgiveness is offered. Salvation is found in the person and work of Jesus Christ alone. (John 14:6, 1 Timothy 2:5-6, 2 Corinthians 5:21, Acts 4:12)

3. Sola Fide (Faith Alone)

Human works can accomplish nothing except condemnation. Salvation is granted to those who by faith place their trust in the perfect work of Jesus. As one repents of sin and places faith alone in Christ, life is found. (Romans 10:17, Romans 5:1-2, Romans 3:28, Galatians 2:16)

4. Sola Gratia (Grace Alone)

The granting of salvation is a free gift of God. Through grace alone does the Lord work in the lives of deadened sinners to bring about conviction and faith. Truly, spiritual life is an unmerited gift from start to finish. (Ephesians 2:8-9, Romans 6:23, 1 Peter 2:9, Acts 16:31)

5. Soli Deo Gloria (To the Glory of God Alone)

The end of mankind is found in the glory of God alone. In the kingdom to come, believers will look back and give all glory to God for their salvation. From beginning to end, the Lord is deserving of all praise. (Romans 11:36, 1 Corinthians 10:31, Matthew 5:16, Philippians 2:9-11)
