#### **THANKSGIVING**

I once attended a special church service that had a dramatic presentation by a group called *Peculiar People*. They introduced one of their first pieces by emphasizing that all that followed was in the Bible.

It was moving. It was powerful. It couldn't be in the Bible!

Or, so I thought.

I was a recent convert to Jesus Christ. I was steadily reading my way through the Bible. However, I had yet to grasp the beauty of the Psalms, in particular, Psalm 136.

As the group read Psalm 136 dramatically, they alternated single voices with a chorus of voices all saying, "His love endures forever" (NIV). It was beautiful. It was moving. It was in the Bible!

Thanksgiving flowed from my heart as God's goodness and love dramatically hit me. From beginning to end Psalm 136 leads you to praise (see verses 1-3, 26). In fact, the Bible leads you there as well. From beginning to end.

All that God does, should lead you to Thanksgiving. Not only the food that satisfies and the land where you live, but every good and perfect gift comes down from our heavenly Father (James 1:17). Children, friends, homes, laughter, music, art, food – all come from God.

God provides not only these good things, but the very best thing. God has given us his son (John 3:16). Our greatest problem, sin, is taken care of. Thank God! Even the great wickedness of putting

# Session Report



The Elders met on Monday, October 9 for their regular monthly Session Meeting. They discussed some shepherding issues and spent an extended time in prayer for the flock under their care.

The Session had the encouraging privilege of examining Ron Vessels as a candidate for Ruling Elder. Ron was nominated last year (2016) and has spent the time since receiving instruction in the qualifications and work of the office. Ron's thorough preparation showed as we discussed the Lord's call upon his heart, his understanding of the Bible, theology, and the role of an Elder. The Session unanimously agreed to present him to you, the congregation, for election as Ruling Elder at our Annual Meeting in February.

Following various ministry reports and updates, the Elders reviewed the idea of using a larger cup on the table for symbolic purposes when celebrating the Lord's Supper. While the larger cup would help people see the element better, it was decided that it could also be misunderstood. In particular, the separate cup might foster an idea that the ministers and the people (drinking from a small cup) are being treated differently. A few other points were debated, but in the end the Session decided to keep the current practice.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer, looking forward to gathering together for a longer planning and prayer day on October 14. Details from that day will be shared in the coming months and during the Annual Congregational Meeting in February.

# Missions Highlight



#### MISSIONS TRIP TO INDIA

What can I say about India? Have you ever been somewhere new, someplace you've not yet experienced, and yet it automatically felt like home? India was that place for me. While there, God showed me some truths that were a blessing to my soul. Firstly, the church of Jesus Christ is EVERYWHERE!! Isn't that cool? It was amazing to witness it in person, although I've read other reports about the global church in the past. Sharing the gospel through stories, games, and songs and praying with the kids of India Village Mission brought so much joy to me. As I interacted with them daily and learned more about their lives, I longed for them to have a complete understanding of their value (and others) as image bearers of the one true God. We don't live in a society of castes here in America, but we do have social levels. Whether in American or India, what a blessing it is to know the feeling of being "untouchable" or "unimportant" for we are then free to embrace the gospel, knowing that we bring nothing to the table but our guilt and walk away RICH in all of Christ's eternal riches! The children at India Village Mission can hear and understand these truths, thanks to the quality interactions with the IVM staff.

There were two things that impacted me the most during our trip. The first was the dedication and work ethic of the IVM staff: Pastor Benjamin, his wife Sister Shyla, Solomon and the other IVM workers. Every day they are with the kids, teaching them, serving them, encouraging them... No sick days, no long vacations. Their dedication reminds me of the apostle Paul, working tirelessly for the gospel of Jesus Christ because of his LOVE for Jesus Christ. And yet they are not "super Christians". This is absolutely attainable for us as well, as we feed the Spirit and starve the flesh.

The second thing that impacted me (probably more than anything else) was the Saturday prayer group that IVM has for the young women. I was honored to be a part of it and to join in prayer (in English and Hindi!) with these young women. Their requests were much like ours, praying for the salvation of their loved ones, victory and healing from sickness and addictions, concerns for doing well in school. Much is the same across the ocean! I enjoyed seeing the similarities and differences as an American woman who knows much freedom and "independence", which I view as a blessing and a curse.

Praise God for the opportunity to see new things! Could that be what God has for you? Is he calling you to witness His power and might through the body of Christ in another country? I encourage you to prayerfully consider a trip like this! Look at it this way, the great commission in Matthew 28 could be viewed as a commandment to acquire more stamps in your passport, for His kingdom.









### Children's Ministries



#### Crossroads Kids Club

Crossroads Kids Club, formerly known as Pioneer Clubs, is a children's ministry of Crossroads Community Church that meets every Sunday evening at the church. The name was changed to Kids Club last year when the new Torchlighters curriculum from the Voice of the Martyrs and the Christian History Institute was introduced. This curriculum focuses on the experiences of Christians who, in response to God's call, dedicated their lives to commitment and service to Jesus. The children at Kids Club have the opportunity to watch videos and learn about missionaries and the countries in which they serve. On some occasions, church members from the countries being studied are invited to do a presentation about their countries. The children ask questions and then pray for the countries and missionary activities. This helps teach the children that the Gospel is for the whole world and every Christian should be a part of sharing it.

Kids Club aims at reaching the children with the Gospel and helping them grow in their Christian faith. This is done through teaching Bible verses and review games, Bible lessons, hands on activities related to the lessons, and Children's Choir. The children come in at 6:00 p.m. and play games till 6:15 p.m. They study and review Bible verses from 6:15 p.m. to 6:30 p.m., then listen to the Bible lesson and do related activities till 7:00 p.m. They then have choir rehearsal till 7:25 p.m.



The pastors and members of Crossroads Community Church have been volunteering their services to this ministry. Other members are also welcomed to help out on a weekly or occasional basis.

#### Children's Choir

The Children's Choir, directed by Cheryl Chewkanes, meets most Sunday evenings at 7:00 p.m. for about 30 minutes, following the Crossroads Kids Club. They learn and rehearse songs that they will sing once a month at the 11:00 a.m. service. They are given a CD with the music so that they can practice at home. The children also prepare songs to sing at a Christmas concert and a Palm Sunday concert. On alternate years, the Christmas concert is a program with costumes and scripted lines. The children also have a chance to play bells at the concerts. All children are welcome to come and sing with the choir.



#### **Junior Church**

Junior Church was started by Bobbie Smith's parents back in 1948 as a means of teaching children about the Gospel while their parents listen and enjoy the sermon during the 11:00 a.m. worship service. Junior Church begins at 11:30 a.m. at the beginning of the pre-sermon hymn and ends when the service ends. There are two family worship Sundays when there is no Junior church: the 4th Sunday in Advent for the service of Lessons and Carols, and Easter Sunday. Junior Church is for children 4 to 10 years old. Older children should remain in the sanctuary with their parents during the sermon.

While in Junior church, the children receive a Gospel lesson, have a snack, work on a craft that goes with the lesson, and participate in a quiz on what they learned. If there is time, they may also play a game depending on how well the lesson goes. Once a month, as a treat, they see a Veggie Tales episode or movie as reward for good behavior. At Christmas, the children have a "Happy Birthday Jesus Party" on the 3rd Sunday of Advent, where they receive a Christmas gift. In the summer, there is a "Staycation Party" where the children play games and have special food.

The Prosses have been leading Junior Church for 15 years, and it warms their hearts to see children so happy to attend with a desire to learn. However, they can always use additional help. Come downstairs and observe a Junior Church class, and ask about how you can provide help on future Sundays.
