REFORMATION SUNDAY

We are glad that you chose to worship with us this Lord's Day. Today we celebrate the 503rd anniversary of the Great Reformation when Martin Luther launched a gospel-centered, culture-shaping movement by nailing his Ninety-Five Theses to the door of the Wittenberg Cathedral on October 31, 1517.

Why should this matter to us, and why should we celebrate the Reformation? On Reformation Sunday, we rejoice in the recovery of the biblical gospel of grace. Simply put, "Christ saves sinners" (I Timothy 1:15). We do not and cannot add anything to our salvation.
