WHY DO WE DO THAT?

The Lord's Supper

We are to remind one another of the importance of the death of Christ until he returns. The Lord's Supper was instituted by Christ himself and so we regularly share in it together.

Remembering

At Jesus' last meal with this disciples he broke bread, called it his "body" and gave it to his disciples and said "do this in remembrance of me."

Receiving

Jesus says that the cup we drink is the cup of "the new covenant in my blood". In the new covenant we receive forgiveness through Jesus' sacrifice on the cross and the Holy Spirit who motivates us and enables us to live in joyful obedience to Christ.

Waiting

The early church regularly observed this meal as a way of actively waiting for Christ's return. The Apostle Paul writes to the Corinthian church "For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes."
