Deuteronomy Parent Resources

Title: God Requires Obedience **Passage:** Deuteronomy 4

Principle: God requires obedience from His people.

Praise: "Obedience"

Prompt: Ask your child these questions:

- What did Moses command the people of Israel?
- How is God glorified through obedience?
- How was Israel different from other nations?
- What would other nations think when they saw Israel obeying God?

Practice: Help your child apply these truths in the following ways:

- By obeying God's commands to bring Him glory.
- By demonstrating God's uniqueness in how he treats others.
- By thanking God for giving laws to guide our lives

This Week: As a family, read Deuteronomy 4.

Next Week: Deuteronomy 6:4-9

Title: God Calls Israel to Love through Obedience

Passage: Deuteronomy 6:4–9

Principle: God calls us to meditate on and obey His Word.

Praise: "I Love You, Lord"

Prompt: Ask your child these questions:

- How was Israel to love God?
- What were parents to teach their children?
- How can we apply God's Word to our lives?
- Should anything be more important to us than God?

Practice: Help your child apply these truths in the following ways:

- By memorizing Scripture to mediate on throughout the day.
 - By applying the truth of God's Word to his life today.
- By checking his heart to make sure nothing has taken God's place.

This Week: As a family, read Deuteronomy 6:4–9.

Next Week: Deuteronomy 11:8–17.

Title: God Promises Blessings or Cursings **Passage:** Deuteronomy 11:8–17; 28:20

Principle: God blesses obedience and punishes disobedience.

Praise: "Trust and Obey"

Prompt: Ask your child these questions:

- What did Israel have to do to receive God's blessing?
- What would happen if Israel disobeyed God?
- How did God promise to bless or curse Israel?
- How can you be obedient to God?
- Are there consequences for disobedience today?

Practice: Help your child apply these truths in the following ways:

• By demonstrating his love for God through obedience to His Word.

- By remembering God's blessings and mercies.

By memorizing God's Word.
By honoring God in all he does.
This Week: As a family, read Deuteronomy 11:8–17 and 28:20.
