1) Support your own favorite local business

WHY: to demonstrate generosity and love our local Davis business neighbors. Suggestions for how to participate in the experience: Go beyond just purchasing food/beverages and try to connect with your server/get to know them, ask about their day/how they are doing in 2020.

2) Clean up your neighborhood park or portion of the greenbelt

WHY: as a public demonstration of your care for God's creation Suggestions for how to participate in the experience: Invite a friend or neighbor to join you!

3) Check in on neighbors and deliver hand-made cards/notes

WHY: build local community and show God's love for all of his image bearers
Suggestions for how to participate in the experience: make cards with messages of
greeting and/or introduction. Provide small pre-wrapped treats.

4) Use the time you would have spent at church to vote

WHY: a practical way to hold then tension between our earthly and heavenly citizenships, a way for us to love our neighbors, and have a voice in our community

Suggestions for how to participate in the experience: use online resources to seek out understanding of props and measures. (See voting guide provided)

5) Purchase supplies to support and partner with the Interfaith Rotating Winter Shelter

WHY: For the past 13 years, the Interfaith Rotating Shelter of Davis (IRWS) has provided a hot meal and a warm bed to unsheltered people during the cold and rainy months. This year, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we are unable to house guests in a congregate setting, that is having guests sleep near each other in one room. We are fortunate that we have received funds to house up to 40 of the most vulnerable people in our homeless community. We have access to 24 two-bedroom apartments in Davis. Each apartment will house up to 2 participants. Our program runs from October 1, 2020 through March 31, 2021. Our program goal is two-fold: 1) to shelter those most vulnerable to COVID-19, that is, those over the age of 65 and those with underlying health conditions and 2) to permanently house 50% of the participants by the end of our 6 month program.
