MODULE 6 - JESUS: SAVIOR KING

1. There are several categories of proofs that Jesus was divine: Jesus' own statements, the testimony of those around him and the recorded demonstrations of his divine power. Of all these categories, which are most winsome to you? Why? Which do you think would be most compelling to a non-Christian co-worker or neighbor? Why?
2. The Apostle John spends the most time in his gospel arguing for the divinity of Jesus and he was one of Jesus' closest friends. What kinds of things would convince you that one of your friends was divine? Miracles? Sinlessness? Wise teaching? Something else?
3. In the middle paragraph of page 5, Justin writes that John's use of "logos" and "theos" to describe Jesus was an intentional, missionary decision to connect the greek idea of logos to the Jewish understanding of God. He then connects both of these ideas to Jesus in a way that ties it all together. How could you be a good missionary to your friends in a similar way? How could you tie in familiar ideas or phrases and show them how it connects to Jesus?
4. What are some implications of believing that Jesus was God? How would that change your life?
5. The deity of Jesus is often more difficult for our friends and neighbors to believe and it can be a major stumbling block. What are some reasons that this is so hard for people to believe? Is it possible that the hardest thing about believing that Jesus was God are the answers to question 4?
