Discussion Questions

1. Every household has its own way of doing things, from chores to eating habits to parenting, etc. For those who are married, think back to when you were newlyweds and share an example of something you and your spouse did differently. Did it cause a conflict? If so, how did you resolve the matter? If you are single, apply this question to a current or previous roommate.
2. Read Galatians 5:1-12. In the Christian life, the visible manifestation of obedience may initially look no different between someone who operates out of legalism to someone who obeys out of love and grace. Share an example of a practical act of obedience for a Christian. How can we guard ourselves from allowing this act of obedience to become a form of legalism?
3. The law does not have the power to inspire us to go beyond the bare minimum. Only grace does. When we operate on the basis of grace, we are inspired to go above and beyond. We don't keep score. How have the actions of any particular Christians in your life inspired you to go above and beyond? Feel free to share a specific example.
4. Our nation needs healing. How can you be an agent of healing this week?
