Lesson 5: Romans 5

John MacArthur said, "It is doubtless true that most unbelievers do not consider themselves enemies of God." However, James tells us in James 4:4 that those who are friends of the world are enemies of God. While unbelievers may acknowledge that God exists and be okay with attending church, God's Word tells us they are enemies of God. The question one will ask is, "How can an enemy of God be at peace with God?" Paul answers this question for us in Romans 5:1–11. In verses 12–21, Paul will explain how sin entered the world through one man's act of sin. But he will show how a greater salvation is accomplished through One Man's perfect sacrifice. Let's dive in and see what Paul has to say about enemies of God being reconciled to God through the obedience of One Man.


	7. According	g to verse 8, how did God demonstrate His love toward us?
