Lesson 6: 1 Timothy 6

We live in a time where so-called pastors are seeking popularity and look no different from Hollywood's movie stars. Many of them are after fame and fortune instead of shepherding God's flock. In Paul's closing words to young Timothy, he gives more identifying marks of false teachers and commands Timothy to stay focused on his calling instead of pursuing monetary pleasures. Paul commands Timothy to pursue things that really matter in life. Let's dive in and study Paul's instructions for his young protégé, Timothy.
