- 1. You are planning on inviting your entire class, except for one classmate, to go camping for your birthday party. (Unkind: This can make your classmate feel left out and sad. You can be kind by getting to know them and including them.)
- 2. You noticed that an unpopular kid was sitting by himself during lunch, and you decided to sit with him. (Kind: You noticed that the unpopular kid was feeling lonely, and you decided to keep him company.)
- 3. An elder woman is struggling to open the door at the grocery store. You stopped to help her. (Kind: You stopped and offered to help someone who needed it.)
- 4. An elder man is trying to push a cart while walking with a cane. You ignore him. (Unkind: You ignored someone who needed assistance. Instead, with an adult's permission, offer to push the cart.)
- 5. A person without a home asks for water. You ask your mom if you could buy him a bottle of water and give it to him. (Kind: You saw a need and decided to act.)
- 6. You noticed that a group of kids is bullying another kid on the playground. You join them. (Unkind: Bullying someone is unkind. You can be kind by standing up for them or asking a trusted adult for help.)
- 7. One of your classmates is crying and upset. You do nothing. (Unkind: You ignored a classmate who was upset. You can show kindness by sitting and listening to them.)
- 8. Everyone is mad and upset at one of your teammates for not scoring a goal. He is upset too. You listen to how he is feeling. (Kind: You supported him by listening.)
- 9. Someone who you are struggling to get along with accidentally spills their juice all over their favorite drawing. You help them clean it up. (Kind: You stopped and offered to help someone who needed it.)
- 10. You find a lost toy on the playground. You give it to a teacher so they can help find its owner. (Kind: Returning the toy to its owner is showing kindness.)
- 11. You see a classmate struggling to carry their heavy backpack. You keep walking. (Unkind: You ignored someone who was struggling. You can be kind by offering to carry the backpack.)
