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Got any idols? Are you sure?

The past few weeks as part of my preparation for our study on 1st Samuel I have been reading through the first eight chapters of this powerful and insightful book daily. Recently, during my reading and study time I was reminded how quickly and easily God's people turned away from following wholeheartedly after the Lord. Seemingly overnight they adopted foreign gods and were worshipping them. And it is very clear that the Israelites were strongly attracted to the worship of Baal and Ashtaroth, and so they erected local high places where sexually oriented and highly charged cult rituals could be practiced.

Tragically, this depraved worship quickly spread, and resulted in Israel's breaking of many of God's commandments, including the commandment to have no other gods before Him. This way of life was in total opposition to everything that Israel should have stood for as the people of God. As God's chosen people they should have known better! Yet, they chose to leave God out of their plans, and as a result they stumbled and fell, bringing tremendous suffering on themselves, their children and their nation.

The first commandment is: "You shall have no other gods before Me. You shall not make for yourself an idol, or any likeness of what is in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters under the earth. You shall not worship them or serve them; for I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God. Exodus 20:3-5.

A simple or basic definition of an idol would be that an idol is anyone or

anything that takes your focus away from God. Scripture makes it clear that our loyalty and love must first and foremost be given to Him. God must be our #1 priority. While we may not be tempted to worship stone or metal gods, or participate in weird cult rituals, don't be fooled into thinking that you are living in a world devoid of false gods or false worship. Quite the contrary, our world is not a godless world, but rather a world that worships that which is false. And when people become enslaved to the worship of these kinds of things, they are dehumanized and destroyed just as quickly as Israel and her neighbor's

Now it's important to understand that we are actually living in a world today that is far more driven by idolatry and sensuality then the one the Israelites faced. But the "false gods" and idols that are worshipped today have different names. And may include worship of things like: self, power, relationships, career, success, possessions, hobbies, addictive substances, money, beauty, sports, politics, clothing, leisure activities, pornography, internet, and on and on it goes.

If you really think about it, it is obvious that we are living in a world that for the most part has lost its bearings because it has abandoned God, and worships the creature rather then the Creator. It is a world that promises personal fulfillment but actually destroys the individual because it is based on a distorted anthropology that says material things are more important than people

Studying this portion of scripture

caused me to ask how could someone ever turn away from worshipping the One, true, living God, in order to turn to that which is false? I also wondered why Israel's relationship with God had grown so cold. What happened? More importantly, I was compelled to ask myself; what must I do to insure that something like that never happens to me or to the ones I love?

Fortunately, Samuel gave God's people the key to victory. He declared that repentance from idolatry and loyalty toward God are the prerequisites for blessing. Therefore, we must be singularly minded and focused on God and His Word. Folks, we need to allow God to set the pace and the priorities in our lives! We also need to be alert and diligent so that the world will be unable to squeeze us into its mold.

Folks, we please the Lord when we maintain an exclusive, loyal relationship to Him. And you know what? God not only demands that He be the priority of our lives.... He deserves to be our #1 priority! God, and God alone is the One to whom all praise, honor, worship and glory is due.

So what about you? Any idols? Anything you need to change? Saints, its never to late to stop where you are and regroup and then move forward in the strength and power of Almighty God.

"Now this is what the Lord Almighty says: 'Give careful thought to your ways.'" Haggai 1:5 (NIV)

(Excerpts from "The J.I. Packer Classic Collection")

"Holiness means, among other things, forming good habits, breaking bad habits, resisting temptatins to sin, and controlling yourself when provoked. No one ever managed to do any of these things without effort and conflict.

"How do we form the Christlike habits which Paul calls the fruit of the Spirit? By setting ourselves, deliberately, to do the Christlike thing in each situation.

- "... Thus, we should think of
- Love as the Christlike reaction to people's malice
- Joy as the Christlike reaction to depressing circumstance
- Peace as the Christlike reaction to troubles, threats, and invitations to anxiety
- Kindness as the Christlike reaction to all who are unkind
- Goodness as the Christlike reaction to bad people and bad behavior
- Faithfulness and gentleness as the Christlike reactions to lies and fury
- Self-control as the Christlike reaction to every situation that goads you to lose your cool and hit out

The principle is clear: The Spirit is with us to empower us, and we know that Christlike behavior is now in the profoundest sense natural to us. But still, maintaining Christlikeness under this kind of pressure is hard."

Defeating Discouragement

"Discouragement can rob peace, joy, and contentment. But I have great news if you feel disheartened: You need not be stuck!

"I've known people who appeared to be in impossible situations. A few years later, however, they were in a terrific place, either in terms of their circumstances or their emotions. The reason? They never gave up. Instead of sulking in self-pity, they chose to believe God and step out in faith. In that way, they did not remain entrenched in an emotional pit.

"Nehemiah is a good example. He had every reason to feel defeated, because his people were in trouble. After receiving news that the city wall had been destroyed, this man of God acknowledged profound disappointment and grieved. Yet doing so was risky, because sadness in the presence of royalty was punishable by death.


"Though pain flooded his soul, Nehemiah didn't allow himself to stay in that low place. Instead, he cried out to God for direction. And the Lord answered with amazing power, prompting the king to notice his servant's sad countenance and then to ask what he could do to help. This miracle led to the rebuilding of the wall and the redemption of God's people.

"The Lord can take an impossible situation—no matter what it is—and move in ways mightier than you can imagine. Do you live in eager expectation of what the Lord will do? Or have you chosen to linger in the depths of despair? Like Nehemiah, turn your disappointment into a petition for God's help. He can restore your hope and prevent negative emotions from gaining a stranglehold on your life."

This so speaks to me this morning!

I was reading and praying today. I read this devotional and was blessed and encouraged by the writers thoughts. I thought you might be blessed by these thoughts too! May it be a blessing to you. Go out and be a link in somebody's chain.

Links in the Chain

Edward Kimball was determined to win his Sunday school class to Christ. A teenager named Dwight Moody tended to fall asleep on Sundays, but Kimball, undeterred, set out to reach him at work. His heart was pounding as he entered the store where the young man worked. I put my hand on his shoulder, and as I leaned over I placed my foot upon a shoebox. I asked him to come to Christ. But Kimball left thinking he had botched the job. Moody, however, left the store that day a new person and eventually became the most prominent evangelist in America.

On June 17, 1873, Moody arrived in Liverpool, England, for a series of crusades. The meetings went poorly at first, but then the dam burst and blessings began flowing. Moody visited a Baptist chapel pastored by a scholarly man named F. B. Meyer, who at first disdained the Americans unlettered preaching. But Meyer was soon transfixed and transformed by Moody's message.

At Moody's invitation, Meyer toured America. At Northfield Bible Conference, he challenged the crowds saying, If you are not willing to give up everything for Christ, are you willing to be made willing? That remark changed the life of a

struggling young minister named J. Wilber Chapman.

Chapman proceeded to become a powerful traveling evangelist in the early 1900s, and he recruited a converted baseball player named Billy Sunday. Under Chapman's eye, Sunday became one of the most spectacular evangelists in American history. His campaign in Charlotte, North Carolina, produced a group of converts who continued praying for another such visitation of the Spirit. In 1934 they invited evangelist Mordecai Ham to conduct a citywide crusade. On October 8th Ham, discouraged, wrote a prayer to God on the stationery of his Charlotte hotel: Lord, give us a Pentecost here. Pour out thy Spirit

His prayer was answered beyond his dreams when a Central High School student named Billy Graham gave his heart to Jesus.

And Edward Kimball thought he had botched the job!

Friends! You are a link in somebody's chain! Pray about who God is asking you to share the Good News of Jesus with. You may never know whose life will be forever changed because of your faithfulness.
