If you've stopped in the hallway outside the church office & taken a look at the bulletin board, you might have noticed our church's "Adopt-a-Room" program. Many families or teams of people have already selected a room to update. They will give of their resources towards this effort, and they will also prayerfully decide upon a verse of dedication for the room, which will be painted on one of the walls.

I am excited about and blessed by this effort, which gives us a unique opportunity to participate in God's work in this place. Giving towards the care of our church facilities is a way that we can demonstrate our gratefulness to God that He has provided this building, where we can gather for worship, listen to and learn from solid biblical teaching, and fellowship together. Our collective work in renewing the physical aspects of the rooms brings external expression to the inward renewal we experience as individuals and as a church body.

Along with serving the church, Boy Scouts has shaped me over the past 6 years of my life. It has taught me the dynamics of leading, physical fitness, and is an allaround fun experience! I am currently a Life Scout, which is one rank below the acclaimed rank of Eagle Scout. One of the 7 requirements for the rank of Eagle Scout is to plan, lead, and carry out a service project to benefit a non-scouting beneficiary. The goal of such a project is to demonstrate leadership through planning and delegation of different jobs as well as what we, as scouts, stand for: to be a help to the community we reside in, wherever that happens to be.

When faced with the idea for my project, I immediately thought of the church. I came to Pastor Marc and asked if there was an idea that the church would like to become a reality. He directed me to Mrs. Waddell and Clay Minter to talk about their idea of an Ebenezer Garden. They explained to me that as Israelites were being led out of Egypt, they would leave monuments of stone along the way to remind them of God's goodness and faithfulness. This is what they envision for the Garden; an ornamental centerpiece where people can place stones and write on these stones what God has done for them.

It wasn't until a couple weeks ago that I felt God tugging at my heart to touch base with the Ebenezer Garden idea. I talked with Clay and he told me that they had done much thinking and

praying about where the garden should be. God revealed to them that He wanted it along the wall of the courtyard closest to the sanctuary, where the stone cross currently hangs on the wall. I now feel sure that this is the path down which God is leading me. I am now in the process of talking with my counselors and constructing a proposal to show my Boy Scout leaders and leaders of the church. Thank you to all those who have given me support. I would love to hear any ideas you have, so if you see me, come and talk to me! I'll probably be rocking out on the drums.

Summer 2016 - FBC Youth



The Women's Ministry will be holding a Rummage/Bake Sale in order to raise funds for our ministry. Beginning on September 1st, we will start collecting donations of rummage sale items that are gently used and/or in good working condition and contain all included pieces. Please be in prayer as to how you could help us with this event.

We are looking for the following items:

Rummage Sale:

- 1. Clothing in good, gently used conditioned. We will not be accepting undergarments or torn/stained clothing.
- 2. Household items which are also gently used and in good working condition. (nothing broken please)
- 3. Electronic items which work and have all the pieces.
- 4. Children's and baby items.
- Car seats can be resold if they have never been in a crash or have not passed an expiration date shown on the car seat.
- Any toys should be clean and contain all accompanying pieces.
- 5. Books in good condition.
- 6. Furniture:
- Please bring any large items before 8:00 to the back parking lot on the morning of the sale.
- Small items can be brought ahead of time.

Bake Sale:

We will be needing home baked goods (cakes, cookies, bars, cupcakes, etc). They may be dropped off the night before or brought the morning of 9/24. We will have a flyer available in September that will give you guidelines for packaging.

Pricina:

We will have generic pricing for clothing, books. and bake sale items. We are asking that you estimate a reasonable price on all other items turned in

Drop Off:

Please bring all items to Room 110 downstairs where we will be storing them. If it is locked please see Sandy Murray, Janet White or Sheryn Cockett. We are unable to store large furniture and, if donated, must be brought the morning of the sale.

Unsold Items:

We will be dropping off unsold items to the Salvation Army. They have certain restrictions on what they can take. If your item is unsold and the Salvation Army will not accept it, we are asking that you be responsible for either disposing of it or removing it. We are not able to store it at church or leave it in the parking lot.

We will be needing women to work the day of the sale, either setting up (7:00) or selling during the morning. A sign-up sheet will be at the information desk in the narthex (back of the church) and an E-mail request will be sent out. There will be coffee, tea and continental breakfast for the early workers.

Last year we were able to not only raise money for the ministry but to witness to those in the community who came. Please be in prayer that God will be glorified at this event and we can act as His ambassadors to those He brings to us.

Dear Friends,

It has been wonderful to see many of you and talk to others on the phone. Audrey and I are so grateful for your prayer, support and friendship!

A student from Vietnam came to know the Lord here a couple of years ago. Recently, she needed to return to Vietnam and we all prayed for her to find a church in her city. We asked her how she was doing and here is her reply:

"It was very uncomfortable when I first moved back here in Vietnam. The life style and the way of thinking has changed. Especially, when I became a Christian and I totally against my family tradition. I refused to go to Buddhist temple with my mom and aunties. I refused to pray to my grandparents (who already passed away). It created many conflicts between me an my family, as respectfulness for the ancestor. But God is Good! I have found a new Christian fellowship near my work place. Although I just visit them only couple times, but I really love it. They are an International home based church. Most of members are foreigners who are working in Vietnam. Pretty similar to our International group, but they are all working professional instead of students."

Here are a few prayer requests from Alan:




Movie Night - Friday, September 30, 6:30 p.m.

nessed the burning of the Millbrae Recreation Center where I work and teach. Flames destroying everything in front of my eyes! I cried and fell into a deep dark place, but, the Lord was there! The recently remodeled classroom was water damaged, but the heart of my room, my little closet was saved. It holds my books, my curriculum, toys, my crafts and supplies. Thank you, Lord, for saving my job!

God is Good! God is almighty! At the annual work luncheon I personally thanked the firefighters who quickly removed everything out of that closet and told them of God's miracle. I have many stories of answered prayers. Just ask me! I'm thankful for the pain I still feel in my healing foot. It reminds me of the sacrifice He suffered on the cross where He died for my sins and salvation.

Thank you, Lord, for always being there with me through the pain, the heartache and the lessons and blessings. I endure with Your LOVE!
