GRACE, GRATITUDE, GRACIOUSNESS

Grace is our gift from Jesus, which creates gratitude for all He has done for us, and creates a heart that treats others with graciousness and forgiveness.

Recently, I read a book by Philip Yantzy called "What's So Amazing About Grace?" It begins with several stories of grace being extended in ways that help us understand what Jesus has done for us.

These stories reminded me of a story I heard many years ago by a Christian comedian, Grady Nutt, speaking at a church conference:

A visiting guest preacher had been invited to have dinner with a family after church. The hostess had done her best to have a beautifully arranged table -- her best silver, crystal goblets, linen napkins and table cloth -- you get the picture.

As the meal progressed, a small son of the family bumped his ice tea and spilled it. His mother quietly began to clean it up as the young boy, feeling all the embarrassment you can imagine, looked like he was trying not to cry. Total silence pervaded the whole group.

All of a sudden, the visiting preacher bumped his goblet and spilled his tea exactly the way it had happened with the boy.

Isn't that what Jesus did for us -- clothed Himself in human form so we would understand His deep awareness of our condition (just as the visiting preacher understood all that little boy was feeling) so that relief and gratitude would pour out from us the way everyone at the table felt, especially the young boy? I don't know of any instance when Jesus intentionally spilled His tea, but He did intentionally spill His blood, taking our sin upon Himself so that we don't need to continue to be guilty. This Baby whose birth we just celebrated has given us so much more to celebrate than exchanging presents and visiting with loved ones.

"And when the days for their puri-fication according to the law of Moses were completed, they brought Him up to Jerusalem to present Him to the Lord (as it is written in the Law of the Lord, 'Every firstborn MALE THAT OPENS THE WOMB SHALL BE CALLED HOLY TO THE LORD') and to offer a sacrifice according to what was said in the Law of the LORD, 'A PAIR OF TURTLEDOVES OR TWO YOUNG PIGEONS.'

"And there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; and this man was righteous and devout, looking for the consolation of Israel; and the Holy Spirit was upon him. And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ. And he came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to carry out for Him the custom of the Law, then he took Him into his arms, and blessed God, and said,

"Now Lord, You are releasing Your bond servant to depart in peace,

'According to Your word;

'For my eyes have seen Your salvation,

'Which You have prepared in the the presence of all peoples,

'A LIGHT OF SALVATION TO THE GENTILES, 'And the glory of Your people

Israel." (Luke 2:22-32)

Just as that old prophet, we have lived long enough to see with our spiritual eyes what amazing grace has been extended to us. How can we not praise our Messiah? And extend that message of grace to others that our community and all of San Mateo will hear and believe!


