This statement has been the guiding theme for our recent renovation project. It is our desire to glorify Christ as we extend the message of Christ to others with a challenge toward faith and trust in Him. As people are reached and lives are transformed there is a sense of thanksgiving that motivates us toward a greater service to Jesus.

Our efforts toward the renovation of our church facilities are done with the intention of fulfilling our vision:

To glorify Christ by making disciples who make disciples in our community and around the world.

In the spring of 1827, Elder Robert Daniel of the Baptist General Association of Virginia, visited the town of Suffolk to share the gospel of Jesus Christ with the local population. Elder Daniel preached several sermons in the "Old Meeting House" that stood on the present site of Cedar Hill Cemetery, and a number of people responded to his message, desiring to be baptized.

On Wednesday morning, September 12, 1827, thirty-three men and women gathered at the Old Meeting House to hear a sermon by Elder Daniel and to sign their names to the Church Covenant. They organized the new Suffolk Baptist Church, which would later become First Baptist Church of Suffolk.


History

The new church flourished, and they soon moved into a new church building on Main Street where the

present church building stands. Not only did they meet for worship, but they began to reach out to their community and to the world through missions.



By the 1880s, the need for a new, larger facility had become overwhelming. A fundraising campaign was begun with-



in the church to provide for that need. The old wooden structure was moved to the rear of the lot, and a new brick structure was built facing Main Street. It was dedicated January 12, 1890.

The next twenty years brought yet further growth, and another expansion of the church building became necessary. In 1912 the new sanctuary expansion was completed and gave the front of the church an entirely new appearance.


The growth of First Baptist Church in the years following World War II resulted in another building program. An entirely new sanctuary was dedicated in 1957, and weekly attendance grew to nearly a thousand people.

The 50's, 60's, and 70's were times of expansion as First Baptist established three new mission churches in the Suffolk area – Wilroy, Southside, and Nansemond River, as well as three other churches in Richmond and Pennsylvania.

In the late 1980s the church constructed a Family Life Center building, thereby opening new opportunities for further ministries and for outreach to the community.

In 2012 the church members decided that it was time to renovate the entire church facility, inside and out, in order to effectively minister to the spiritual needs of people in the twenty-first century.

After three years of preparation, study, and construction, the new facility is ready for use as its members seek to fulfill the Great Commission.
















