In the summer of 2012, Pastor Thurman Hayes shared with the First Baptist Church congregation his concerns regarding the condition of the church buildings and facilities. Having grown up in this church, Pastor Hayes had fond memories of its halls, classrooms, sanctuary, and the people who worshiped there. Now, after returning as its pastor, he observed that the facilities were showing the effects of the passage of time and the need for renovation.

A committee was appointed to determine what improvements needed to be made, what the costs would be, and how the costs would be funded. Through an intense investigation the committee identified more than fifty deficiencies that needed to be addressed. After numerous meetings with representatives from other churches, consultants, architects, engineers, and builders, the committee brought a recommendation for improvements to the church. The proposed improvements would constitute the eighth major construction project undertaken by First Baptist Church of Suffolk in its nearly two hundred year history. It became one of the church's most ambitious, as it sought to meet the spiritual needs of the community well into the 21st century.

A second part of the committee's proposal was that the the construction. The church approved this recommenda-

church undertake a stewardship campaign to begin funding tion. The fundraising campaign was entitled By His Grace – For His Glory, and the term eventually came to represent the entire construction project.

The By His Grace – For His Glory campaign netted \$816,000 in contributions and pledges from church members. This, along with \$329,000 already in hand, represented a good start toward the cost of the construction project.

First Baptist Church dedicated its newly renovated facility on September 20, 2015.

As the three-year pledges of By His Grace – For His Glory expire, the church still faces monthly loan payments of \$17,500.



### Results

During the last three years the congregation at First Suffolk has given generously. We have seen God provide through the gifts of his people over \$700,000 to the church building fund.

# Space

We have remodeled and added 20,000 square feet of our facility. The new tower and the front welcome entrance enhance the exterior beauty of the buildings. The refurbished steeple and exterior enhancements allow the presence of our facility to shine brightly in downtown Suffolk.

# Fellowship & Welcome Spaces The new fellowship and welcome space allow us to

make a great first impression with those who visit with us weekly. This space allows quality fellowship for attenders and members between each service. This space also allows for groups to gather during the week for Bible studies and social gatherings.

## Worship Enhancements

We gather weekly for numerous services in the church sanctuary. The greatest number of first time guests who visit our facility do so in our Sunday am service. Upgrades to the sanctuary allow us the opportunity to glorify Christ through enhancements to worship as God is glorified through music, preaching, and giving.

### Preschool Security & Education Space

Our desire to disciple the next generation begins in our preschool and nursery areas. Our increased level of security allows parents to feel comfortable as they bring their families to our campus. The biblically illustrated classrooms give a place to teach the depth of God's love to each of our little ones.

## Children's Education Space

Children's ministry is a driving force of our church. Disciples are made as we teach the great stories of the Bible and Scripture memorization is emphasized. The third floor of the Traylor building provides attractive classrooms to teach children the hope of the gospel.

#### Student Center

The worship of Christ and the teaching of God's Word is vital in our ability to reach the students of our community. Places for teaching, worship, and fellowship have been renovated and provide space for authentic teaching and missional ministry.
