

The novel coronavirus, COVID-19, has been declared a worldwide pandemic by the World Health Organization. COVID-19 is extremely contagious and is believed to spread mainly from person-to-person contact. First Baptist Friendswood has put in place preventative measures to reduce the spread of COVID-19; however, First Baptist Friendswood **cannot guarantee that you and/or your child will not become infected with COVID-19**. Further, participation could increase your risk of contracting COVID-19.

Below are the procedures we will be following for Collide 2021 (subject to change based on decisions made through a collaborative effort of our church staff and medical advisory team).

First Baptist Friendswood Collide 2021 Protocols

(We will mask, and social distance based on the protocols that are in effect at the time of the event for the location site attended.)

WEEKEND BUBBLE

- Each church will essentially create their own bubble for the weekend
- Check in Friday evening will happen at each host home (or church campus if no host homes)
- Check in at the home or church campus will involve a temperature check as well as a symptom check list signed by a parent or guardian.
- Temperature and symptoms check will be repeated both Saturday and Sunday morning at the host home or church campus before the activities for the day begin.
- During worship, meals and Saturday REC time, each church group will be properly social distanced (6ft)
- REC equipment will be sanitized between each use by a different church group.
- Each participating church with First Baptist Friendswood will have their own check in for students who are late or are returning from a scheduled activity to enter their church's bubble.

TRANSPORTATION

- Parents or guardians will drop off their student at their host home (or church campus) and sign the symptom check list.
- All parents acknowledge that their student can ride with their family group that they are assigned to for the entirety of the weekend.

HOST HOMES (if applicable)

- All parents acknowledge that their student will make a "family group" for the weekend and not be able to social distance from their 7-10 person group for the weekend.
