



## Honduras Mission Trip June 9-16, 2014 General Information



**Purpose of Trip** – To take the word of Jesus to an unsaved nation. We will be doing modified VBS in the local churches and schools.

**Training** – Training is mandatory for all going on the trip. Due to school schedules and the dates of the trip, training is scheduled for Saturdays so that our college participants can make them: Saturday March 22nd, Saturday April 19th, Saturday May 10th and Sunday June 1. Saturday trainings are 6-7:30pm and the Sunday, June 1 training is 12:30-2:30pm (grab a fast food lunch and bring it to the training).

**Cost of trip** - \$1200 for FBCF participants

**Location** – La Ceiba, Honduras (3<sup>rd</sup> largest city in Honduras) – 300,000 people. This is a modern city with a mall and food places such as Pizza Hut, Burger King, Wendy's & Kentucky Fried Chicken to name a few. You will have the opportunity to purchase bottles of water each day. Do not drink any water not from a bottle and do not eat any raw vegetables or fruits that have been washed in the local water. Also, do not buy any food from the local street vendors. We are scheduled to stay in the same hotel as previous years, The La Quinta on the night we arrive. On Tuesday, we will be traveling to the town of Trujillo, which is about 3 hours from La Ceiba. This is an exciting time as we will be one of the first mission teams allowed into the schools in Trujillo. We will have translators and drivers from La Ceiba with us in Trujillo. On Saturday we will return to La Ceiba for 2 nights and will attend Monte Horeb Church Sunday.

**Baggage** – 1 checked piece per person (CANNOT weigh more than 50 pounds) and 1 carry on per person. You may want this to be a back-pack so you will have it for the week. Great for throwing in bottles of water, snacks, etc.

**Arrival** – Passport required. Your passport must have at least **6 months validity left** on it once you return to the United States. When going through customs, you will be photographed and possibly fingerprinted. A temporary VISA will be issued at customs.

**Local Transportation** – We will be met at the airport in San Pedro Sula by the local contact, Pastor Jorge and Noel our interpreter. He will be our guide for the week. The trip from the airport to the hotel will be about 3 ½ hours, through old banana and pineapple plantations.

**Dress** – Females, no short shorts. Longer basketball shorts are fine. Capri pants are fine. For Sunday and night services a dress or skirt/top (again to knees or longer) will be needed. Males, pants or jeans or long shorts for the week and for Sunday dress pants or jeans with a pull-over collared shirt (if you are "preaching" in one of the services, you might want a jacket). No tank tops, muscle shirts, halters, spaghetti strap shirts for anyone. The Honduran people dress their best for Sunday and Wednesday night services. Girls – fanny packs are strongly suggested or a sling purse. Guys – money belts are the suggestion for you. Bring a swimsuit. There is a pool at the hotel and we may have the opportunity to go to the beach one day. Not sure what our free day will be this year.

**Passport** – Please make four copies of your passport. Leave one at home, bring one to leave with Lou Ann at the church, give one to Teresa Ball and leave one in your suitcase in the hotel. Carry your passport on you at all times.

**Money** – Take very little cash. Your meals are covered in the cost of the trip. You will need spending money for snacks and souvenirs. They will give us Honduran money (Lempira's) when we arrive for our meals. There is a bank at the local mall where we can get additional money exchanged if we need, but this takes a couple of hours.

**Medical** – You need to have a current Tetanus shot and also a current Hepatitis A vaccine. You will also need to be taking Malaria medicine. It is **STRONGLY** suggested that you bring some type of Z-Pak, etc in the event you get sick. Take my word; I was glad I had it. Please see your family doctor. Please carry all medicine in your carry-on.

**Food** – If you have space in your suitcase, throw in some peanut butter crackers, pop-tarts, granola bars, or anything else easy to grab and go. We do not have planned breakfast times each day so if you need breakfast have it with you when you leave the hotel. There is a Dunkin' Donuts right next door to the hotel that we can grab donuts and coffee from each morning.
