# Remember Easter BY JOEL SUTTON

Georg Gärtner, a young German man, found himself in North Africa in 1943 as part of Rommel's North African Campaign. If you know your history, Fredrick Montgomery, the pompous British field marshal, defeated Rommel at Tunis in 1943 and captured thousands of German young men. The British handed over these German prisoners to the Americans, and the Americans brought them to the United States for imprisonment.

Georg was one of those German prisoners and he was sent to Fort Denney, a prison camp in New Mexico. He thought: I'm condemned. I'm a prisoner of war. I was part of that Nazi war machine, and for the rest of my life I will live as a condemned man.

In 1945, Georg slipped past a guard, lifted up the fence, fled Fort Denney, and jumped aboard a passing freight train. He changed his name to Dennis F. Whiles, and found work as a lumberjack, a dishwasher, and laborer, moving from one job to another, constantly terrified his bosses would discover that he was a condemned man and send him back to the prison camp.

He married. At one point Georg became a ski instructor and in 1955 he joined a ski expedition that was formed to rescue a train that had been caught in a blizzard in the Sierra Nevada mountains.

Eventually his wife, tired of moving, said "I can't take this any longer. What's wrong with you? Why are we constantly moving like this?"

Georg then shared with her what he had never shared with anyone before—he was an escaped prisoner of war, a man condemned. She looked at him and said, "Go to the office of immigration and naturalization. The war is over." Finally, when he was 64 years old, he broke and went to the office of immigration and naturalization. They released him from the charges and made him a United States citizen.

As I read that story, I wondered, "How many times did somebody knock on Georg's door, and he went pale, thinking, 'They've shown up; somebody's found me out. It's the authorities. I'm a condemned man. They're going to put me back in prison again?'"

Then I thought about Christ-followers. How many of you live under a similar tension and pressure of feeling condemned? As you read this story, behind your relaxed smile, there is a sense of fear of being found out. Underneath there is a deep sense of guilt. Of shame.

Here is the good news of Easter: Because of what Jesus Christ did on the cross and His resurrection, you are no longer under condemnation. You are free.

Romans 8:1 tells us, "There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus."

Condemnation comes from the devil. And his purpose is to put you down and make you feel guilty and ashamed. When Satan condemns you, it can leave you with a sense of hopelessness.

Too often I find Christ-followers, children of the King, living under condemnation and guilt, thinking that they are listening to the voice of God. But it is not. It is the devil speaking.

This Easter, we need to remember what the Apostle Paul instructed his young protege Timothy to do, "Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, the offspring of David as preached in my gospel." (2 Timothy 2:8).

Remember, what Jesus has done for you. Remember his love, his sacrifice, and his resurrection. And remember because you are in Christ, there is no condemnation. You are free to live as one of God's beloved children.


