Here are a few glimpses of how God is reaching the people of Uganda through their work!

God is calling sinners to repentance through the outreach ministries at SOS. SOS staff and missionaries lead Bible studies in the local villages throughout the week. We attended one discussing Romans 6, and we were excited to hear the men asking questions about how to turn from repetitive sins and walk in righteousness. Families affected by disabilities are also being reached. The SOS team has been canvassing the villages for several months to prepare for the upcoming Joni & Friends Wheels for the World trip, which includes FBC members Kenny & Rebecca Allison and Mark & Kathleen Hetzel.

Many Ugandan families have been invited to hear the message of the Gospel, receive the practical help of a wheelchair, and have their homes modified to make them accessible for the new equipment. The SOS staff is looking forward to this opportunity to imitate Christ in both physical and spiritual care. Legacy Christian Academy is training local children how to glorify God in their studies and all aspects of their lives. Our team discussed the life of Joseph with the high school class. Many of them also had difficult relationships with other family members, and Joseph's example of forgiveness and mercy towards his brothers had direct application to their lives. God is drawing the community in to hear and receive Gospel Truth!

Through these outreach ministries, many children and adults have been attending Community Bible Church of Kubamitwe (Koo-bah-me-tway). Many walk a mile or more to get to church! The Sunday morning service was vibrant as we sang songs of praise in English and Lugandu. The people were eager to hear the Word, welcome us as guests, and share their stories of how God used SOS to bring them to church, repent of their sins, and follow Christ as Lord. The mid-week chapel service reminded believers of their choice to live man's way, or God's way. It also served to create unity and excitement around the mission of SOS to reach the local community with the message of Christ. God is building His church in Kubamitwe!

As the church at SOS has grown in influence, God has established Shepherds Training Center (STC) to teach men how to interpret the Word, preach effectively, and lovingly shepherd their flocks. After completing their training, they'll return to the far corners of Uganda and South Sudan, to their local tribal language and culture. What an opportunity to send men of many tribes and tongues to evangelize the lost and equip others to do the same! Shannon Hurley partners with and encourages the leaders of the Baptist Union, an affiliation of like-minded churches

who nominate most of the men who come to STC. SOS also opens their campus several times a year to host conferences for the Baptist Union, continuing the work of equipping and encouraging pastors to serve faithfully throughout Uganda! This year, STC will start its 3-year degree program and invite pastors and their families to live on campus during their studies. We were so thankful to be able to witness what God has been building and are excited to see what He will continue to do in and through these men.

Thank you for your prayers during our trip! God certainly answered your prayers in the opportunities He provided for us to proclaim the Gospel and the privilege to see how Christ is building His church in Kubamitwe and throughout Uganda.

Short Term Missions: Dubai

Opening my Weather App this morning, I see the temperature in Dubai is 102 degrees Fahrenheit... with a "feels like" temperature of 123 degrees Fahrenheit at nearly 7 PM. It certainly felt that way when we left the airport at nearly 11:30 PM,

bags in hand and TJ Smith as our guide transporting Jason Pince, Art and me to his nearby family home.

I knew little of the city of Dubai prior to landing. If one were to do an internet search, details would immediately emerge: "Dubai is a city and emirate in the United Arab Emirates (UAE) known for luxury shopping and ultramodern architecture." This was hardly the world our trio of travelers had come from. Just a day before, we had been on the campus of SOS ministries in Uganda. It is stunning how air travel can quickly thrust one

from a rural developing world to the most populous extravagant city in the UAE in under six hours! Though our heads were slightly spinning, we managed to make the necessary adjustments to a new climate and context.

We rose early enough Sunday to share the family's morning routine, chatting our way through breakfast and afternoon lunch prep

before piling into the van for the trip to a hotel ballroom where the members of Redeemer Church of Dubai meet. This location provides the space needed in a dense city for the large congregation to gather week by week. Our worship in song was sweet and familiar, differing only in the number of people and nationalities surrounding us. The pastor preached from a challenging section in the book of Judges but pointed our eyes heavenward to King Jesus, the only king who is perfectly just and righteous. We were reminded that in His presence "every tribe, tongue, and nation" will gather and worship for all eternity.

Afterward, Art, Jason, and I visited with vari-

ious members of the congregation. Jason met Dave and Samuel. In their quest for work, the Lord brought them to Dubai and later to Redeemer to worship and fellowship.

Here their faith deepened and they both made a commitment to stay and faithfully serve on staff at Redeemer. I had the privilege of meeting a young woman from the Philippines whose sister had settled in Japan and urged her to leave the Philippines to make a life for herself in another country. Seeking financial stability, this young woman took

her sister's counsel and settled in Dubai. While there, she not only found work but found a beautiful community of believers at Redeemer Church! Here she came to understand the gospel, and eagerly pursued Christ and the fellowship of His people. She now serves as support staff at Gulf Theological Seminary (GTS) where TJ Smith is both professor and Dean of Students.



The mission of GTS is to "equip pastors, church planters and lay leaders to multiply faithful churches in the Middle East, South Asia, East Asia, and Africa." Many who attend church at Redeemer also study at GTS. Though several seminary instructors and students were on break at the time of our visit, we were thankful for the few with whom we were able to connect. It is clear that God is at work in many hearts and lives in Dubai.

My personal highlight that Sunday morning was meeting the friends Chaya and Afsana have made since their arrival in Dubai in June 2021.

We prayed for these friends and now Chaya and Afsana were pointing out answers to those prayers as they eagerly introduced me to each cherished friend. In the same way, I enjoyed meeting several seminary students' wives as well as pastors' and elders' wives who have become dear to Karen's heart. There is a backstory to that blessing:

Art, Jason, and I had missed our original flight from Entebbe to Dubai. That unexpected event meant that I also missed a brunch speaking en-

gagement in Karen's home. She graciously filled in the gap leading the women in a discussion from the book of Colossians. On Sunday morning, I met several of the women who attended that brunch. Without exception, each one I met said with enthusiasm, "We were sorry you could not make it, but we were SO VERY ENCOURAGED by all that Karen shared!!" Their gratitude was deep and my heart was blessed by the goodness of God in an unforeseen providence. I am confident God will use that unique speaking opportunity as Karen builds into the lives of ministry leader wives in days to come!

After worship service and a full morning with the congregation of Redeemer Church, we enjoyed a homemade biryani lunch (slow-cooked spiced rice and chicken) and good ministry conversation with the Smiths before heading for our tour of downtown. The Burj Khalifa dominates the skyline and stands just over half a mile high. Though downtown Dubai is a "glam and glitzy" hub sporting many of the "largest, tallest, and grandest" of buildings, the grandeur of it all is dwarfed by the mighty work of grace

we witnessed in the lives of the Smith family.

We were so encouraged by the faithfulness of TJ and Karen as they have clearly invested in the lives of their four children. We witnessed the fruit of their labor as we shared in a joyful family dynamic and observed each child thriving in their own way. Their four children, each adopted at different times in the country of India, have been shown an abundance of sacrificial and relentless love over the years. Their personal stories have found them embraced and faithfully mentored

by this sincere Christ-following couple. It is the quiet, unseen work of discipleship in their own home that is the ground from which TJ and Karen launched their ministry in the local church and seminary. Seeds of faith are being sown that we trust will bear rich fruit in the years to come.

Our goal in traveling to Dubai briefly on our way home from Uganda was to encourage the Smith family and have a glimpse of the world in which they serve. In many ways, it is they who have encouraged and challenged us. First-

hand we were able to see the fruit of a couple who has been "faithful over a little," serving in the quiet spaces of their own home and in India for years, long before being given the opportunity to be "faithful over much" at GTS in Dubai.

Pray for TJ as he begins a new year instructing the students of GTS and for Karen as she continues to faithfully fulfill her roles and responsibilities in the home. Pray for both as they minister
