25 meetings a year.

Why does FBC host this?

Deuteronomy 11:18 tells us to fix God's words in our hearts and minds. Hebrews 4:12 proclaims His Word is alive and active. For 65 years, the program "AWANA"

has had a history of world-wide success with their mission: "Reach Kids, Equip Leaders and Change the World." And Foothill Bible Church gets to be a part of this...

FBC's AWANA Missionaries, Steve and Karen Hydanus, shared, "We feel that AWANA is an amazing tool to help young people learn to dig into God's word, to come to learn about God, their need for Christ, and then to become equipped to share this message with others. The personal testimony of both Karen and me is that God used

scriptures we had memorized in childhood to bring us to walk with God in adulthood".

Well, what IS AWANA?

AWANA. Approve Workman Are Not Ashamed. 2 Timothy 2:15 reads, "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman who needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." The real heart of AWANA is evangelism and

discipleship. The hope and prayer of AWANA is "All children and youth throughout the world will come to know, love and serve the Lord Jesus Christ", so teaching them to know Him, love Him, and be more like Him is central. The ultimate outcome of this is bringing children to truth in professing faith in the One True God and out of their outpouring of this love for their Redeemer brings out love for others, service, evangelism.

What does this look like?

Typically, a night of AWANA is in three parts, an activity (game) time, a teaching time, and small group. (With themed nights like "Crazy Hair Night" and "Western Night" sprinkled in throughout the year to add extra fun!) Steve shared, "Game time gets them in the door. If they are not there, they do not hear. The teaching time is where they hear the message of Jesus death, burial and resurrection, that precious Gospel. The small group is what many think of as simply handbook time, but it is the magic of AWANA. A caring leader pours into the lives of five kids and models the love of Christ."

"I believe that AWANA is the most powerful outreach ministry FBC has. We preach the gospel every Sunday night and kids bring friends every Sunday night. So we are potentially sharing the gospel every Sunday with kids who have never heard the gospel before," shared Kyle Astadurian, FBC's AWANA Commander for the last six years. His wife, Beth, serves as the AWANA secretary. They have been serving in AWANA since they were 15 and 16 years old in various capacities. Kyle shared, "We believe that serving God is

the supernatural by-product of loving God. We love the opportunity to commit to a ministry on a weekly basis that is powerful and that furthers the kingdom of God." Every year their goal is to reach more kids through AWANA.

Steve and Karen Hydanus, as FBC's very own AWANA missionaries, oversee the AWANA programs for churches in the Los Angeles County and North Orange County area and a handful of churches in San Bernardino county, including Foothill. They serve around 150 churches. This could look

different on any given day and season of the year. One of the bigger jobs is getting new churches off to great starts. Steve and Karen help them understand not only the mechanics of AWANA but also the heart and soul. It is not about memorizing words or follow this formula. It is about integrating **AWANA** into the DNA of the church, and about integrating the DNA of a particular church into their AWANA club. Each club memorizes the same verses of God's word, and utilizes similar formats teaching and game

times. Steve and Karen advise new clubs on melding these basics into the culture of their particular demographics, whether those are socio-economic or cultural. In those 150 churches the Hydanus' serve, over half are what would be considered ethnic. We serve Korean, Chinese, Hispanic, Romanian, and a host of others. Los Angeles is not only the most populous county in the nation, it is one of the most diverse. While the gospel does not change, the methods each cultural group may use to reach kids effectively could and often do differ.

Steve goes on to say, "It is imperative we equip our young people with His words written on their hearts. AWANA is a fun way to encourage children to memorize God's words in a supportive setting and to grow in our Lord. It reaches kids. We see it in our churches and hear the testimonies of adults who share how God has used their memory work from their youth in their adult lives. It works. We are blessed to be a part of this ministry."

So, this all does sound awesome, but is AWANA for my family?

My family has chosen to send our children to AWANA to hide God's words in their heart, with the hope and prayer one day that the Holy Spirit turns the light on to the truth they have learned from a young age. One interesting thing is, while AWANA is created for children, it is not just for children or even the leaders. The parents get the joy of reading the Bibles stories, preparing for the next lesson, and helping their children memorize the verses. I find myself learning God's words more diligently because of AWANA. Our family has seen the benefit of having the verses slide off not just our children's tongues but ours as well. We know it's a time commitment (not just on Sunday evenings from 4:30-6:30 p.m.), but the weekly preparation that goes into pouring into the lessons and memorization. But as we plan our weeks, where is our focus? We see AWANA as a tool to cultivate our time on prioritizing God's word, evangelism and loving our neighbors. What a blessing it is to be in a body where AWANA is not only hosted but truly valued!
