

From the Pastor's Workshop

"Knowing the Way"

I was talking to Karen Dahlen today about how we know things like music and theology. We agreed that no matter how gifted someone may be it really is a matter of discipline and CONTINUAL learning. To hear Karen play to the glory of God is a gift, but it is a gift that she is able to offer because for her LIFE she has been learning and learning what it means to speak through music.

The same is true for us in our faith. It is not something that is learned and done. We are forever learning the way to belong "body and soul in life and in death, not to ourselves but to our faithful Savior Jesus Christ". How will we learn the way this month as we travel toward celebrating the Resurrection of our Lord on the last day of the month? I want to suggest that it will come through "playing our scales" every day in some way. There are a lot of places I know how to get to, simply because I LOVE to be there and to which have worn a literal or figurative path with my head, my heart and my feet. The path to the cross comes from knowing where Jesus went. He did not let himself become distracted. He stayed on the path.

If I know where I need to go I will do the same. How does this happen? I think it happens because we WANT it to happen and we seek the means. An example of this is that Karen doesn't try to practice the piano and watch "Downton Abbey" at the same time! Another example is elder Gloria Macdonald asking me for a list of books and authors to read because she says,"... this electronic/information age is just bombarding us with useless, senseless, godless garbage. I just have to tune it out as much as I can." The only way we can do this is to put our hearts, heads, and feet on the right path because as our late friend elder Ralph Hines would often say, "Nature abhors a vacuum".

So what are we filling our paths with? Is it familiarity with "whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable"? (Philippians 4:8) What this Scripture clearly states is that there is A path that leads to where Jesus is going and there are those that DO NOT. This season and all our days for that matter, are the time for becoming increasingly clear with that path and rejecting that which is not.

What paths do we need is step away from? If we are really honest with ourselves, what are we doing, thinking, saying, reading, watching, listening to that are not true, honorable, just, pure, pleasing and commendable by God? This isn't hard to know, but it takes honest discipline to do. I praise God for growing up with examples of people who simply just didn't make time to walk paths that were not God's paths. And if they did they said so and turned around. Watching someone you respect turn around and say with their feet as much as their words, "We're not going that way" is the most effective learning experience we can have. Will we be learners and followers who will live our faith this way?

There will be plenty of <u>opportunities</u> for this in March. On Wednesdays we will have our "Soul De-Tox" class. Sunday, March 17 there is a class on what it means to be a member of the Church from 3-5 PM. On the evening March 28 there is our Tenebrae Communion Maundy Thursday service. The following day on Good Friday we will have our Stations of the Cross interactive experience in the sanctuary from noon to 7:00 PM. Of course there is worship each Sunday. And what we read AND let go "between the lines" on our way will put our feet on the path to belonging only to Jesus' way.

My greatest desire in this short life is to be more and more about knowing and belonging to and serving Jesus Christ and less and less about any other path because (and I know this is very exclusive) no other path matters. JESUS said this. HE was exclusive, but he was exclusively inclusive. Only HIS path led to the cross and only the cross can make us whole.

SO, let's go walk THIS path together and invite everyone we know to join us.

Preparing the Way of the Lord

On the previous page, Bruce challenged us be intentional about our faith journeys – to seek things that build us up and avoid things that lead us astray. I want to talk about the destination. I know from my days as a runner that it is easier to keep moving when aim your eyes as far down the trail as possible. As we walk with our Lord on this earth – what do we expect to happen? Where will faithfulness take us? What fruits are we after?

Personal transformation – God meets us where we are, but he doesn't leave us there. We believe that we are born again of the Spirit. "Now that you have purified your souls by your obedience to the truth so that you have genuine mutual love, love one another deeply from the heart. You have been born anew, not of perishable but of imperishable seed, through the living and enduring word of God" (1 Peter 1:22-23). We expect that as we walk with Jesus – we will grow to be more like him and enjoy the fruit of the Spirit: "love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control (from Galatians 5:22-23).

Eternity with God – I love how the hymn "Amazing Grace" puts it: "When we've been there ten thousand years bright shining as the sun, we've no less days to sing God's praise than when we'd first begun." The amazing truth is that our time is so brief compared to eternity that faithfulness – no matter how costly – is always worth it. "So we do not lose heart. Even though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being renewed day by day. For this slight momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure." (2 Corinthians 4:16-17)

Sharing the Gospel – By grace we have been saved, and we have been saved for a purpose. Jesus does *NOT* say, "Take my silk slippers upon you and snooze for a while." He says, "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." (Matthew 11:29) We join with Christ to do his work – to call the world to repentance and to receive God's grace. We **witness** the effect of the gospel on our own lives. And we **bear witness** as we tell the world about how we have been changed.

This Lent and Easter, let's keep our eyes on the prize – and "let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God." (Hebrews 12:1-2)

NOTES FROM THE MUSIC ROOM March

Worship -- Are We Seeking God?

What do you think of when you read the above question? Do you wonder why you need to seek God, since He already knows where you are? Perhaps you wonder whether God is even thinking about you. Maybe you don't think about God so He needn't think about you, thank you.

I've been reading a book called "The Way of the Worshiper", by Buddy Owens. He talks about how God can be found in the day to day, moment by moment. He is in our living and breathing --remember it is God issued breath! Buddy sees himself as an average person, nothing too earthshaking in his life; wife, kids, no great wealth, not famous -- just a regular guy. But -- he has this way of honing in on the important things in life -maybe I should say the important THING in life: knowing God. He doesn't think that he has "arrived", nor that he has it "all together". He realizes that he exists solely for God's purposes. Have you ever looked at your life that way? It really changes my focus!

In Romans (12) Paul says, "1 Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. 2 Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will." (NIV)

In my February Trumpet article I talked a little about what worship looks like: obedience, surrender, honesty and openness. This passage from Romans doesn't tell us to beat ourselves up, but it does say to move away from the pattern of this world (something that Bruce has talked about recently), to be transformed by reading God's thoughts (the Bible), to pray so that we can find out what God's will is for us (that is transforming as well). Worship is not just done in a large (or small) sanctuary with others, it is also done in quiet and not so quiet moments (think arrow prayers) of our lives. Do we look for God in all our encounters throughout our day? We will not know the total consummation of worshipping God until we arrive in heaven, but for now we can pursue Him with all our being -- and that will make all the difference to us and to others with whom we interact! Buddy talks about the paradox of of being found by God and yet having to always search for Him. He illustrates this by asking us to think of lost sheep. Once the sheep has been found by the shepherd, it spends the rest of its life pursuing the shepherd, following his lead, listening for his voice. We have sheep and shepherds here in Northern Nevada. If you get an opportunity to see them, take note of how the sheep behave with the shepherd.

Lastly, for now, Buddy talks about sensing God's presence daily and moment by moment in his life, not because God decided to "show up", but because Buddy (or you or I) decided to show up. Are we making ourselves available to God? Do we realize that even though we are sinful, inconsistent and insecure, God takes delight and pleasure when we show up to be present with Him? We all have equal access to God -- are we connecting with Him daily?
