From the Pastor's Workshop

"WHERE TO FROM EASTER?"

I find it very significant that the Sunday after Easter is often a very low attendance Sunday in churches around America. The week before, the sanctuary is quite full and the message of the Resurrection is proclaimed in word and music. This is the message of eternity. I know some people feel like, "Well, yes, it's inspiring, but I heard it and I'll come back and hear it again next year, maybe." I don't mean this as a criticism, but simply a comment on how culturally we have lost touch with the need for the eternal.

Maybe it's because I AM getting older and perhaps because I deal with the literal nature of death so often, but I find more and more I need to be into with the promise of eternity. More and more I realize I'm not going to be here forever. But there IS forever. If people are banking on there being no eternity, all I can say is, "They better HOPE they are right!" Because if they are not, (and the Bible says they aren't) there are some MAJOR consequences that they will need to deal with.

The greatest consequence is that of not being with God. See, we were created with a need for God. There is a yearning for something more than all the very best there is in this life. Jesus came as God in person to show us this and to give his life to be our bridge back into relationship with God. That connection was broken in a way WE could never reestablish when we rebelled against God and went our own way. Jesus' death and resurrection redeem that broken relationship, but God does not force anyone back into it. We have to want that relationship.

Where we go from Easter is into a new day of living into that relationship and it can only be known through what Jesus called, "His body" the Church. Easter is the beginning of a new life, but it is only a beginning. It is a call to a personal relationship that needs to grow every day of the rest of our journey in this life. That growth happens as we come together to worship and pray and praise and learn and serve day in and out. Something deep and mysterious happens as we enter into this devotion and only those who make this a lifestyle ever really learn about this relationship.

This month and in months to come we will be exploring what it means to BE the Church; the body of Christ as each Sunday we gather to worship around the book of the Acts of the Apostles. The word "apostle" means, "one who is sent out". Together we will discover where God is sending us from Easter and each week we will gather back to tell of our adventures and to praise God for the opportunity to be his witnesses.

So where DO we go from Easter? We go with Jesus into the world with his saving word of grace.

WE, THE CHURCH, EXIST FOR THE BENEFIT OF OUR NON-MEMBERS

During my preparation for a confirmation lesson on the church, I came across a list of potential problems for congregations. One caught my attention. Dan Migliore writes: "Not only is religious belief and practice individualized in modern culture, it also assumes a *privatized* form. That is, the world of work and public affairs is separated from the world of domesticity, leisure, personal nurture, and religion. The process of privatization severs the message and mission of the church from the larger questions and struggles of life. If any purpose of the church is recognized, it is to serve the needs of private individuals and small homogeneous groups." (from *Faith Seeking Understanding*) In other words, we settle into a "holy huddle" where the church exists only for our benefit.

We are blessed to have a very enjoyable church. We have fun together. We love laughing together. We know we're not perfect, and that's the whole point. We share in God's redeeming love together. "10Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy." (1 Peter 2:10)

The comfort that comes from Christian community is a blessing from God, but we can't stop there. God has established us as his people to bring comfort to the whole world, namely through bringing people to know and trust Christ. We can't proclaim the good news to the world if we're too busy enjoying our holy huddle.

Consider the Trinity. God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit had all the communion they could ever need, yet God chose to create us and love us. And when we rebelled and pushed God away, God made us co-heirs with Christ at great expense to the original fellowship. Jesus was forsaken by God (Mark 15:34) so that we could adopted into the family.

Here's how I think it is supposed to work: God invites us into his family where we receive all the love, forgiveness, and support we could ever need. We enjoy this as a gift, but we know that we are being strengthened so that we can be sent out to invite still more people to join the family. "³We declare to you what we have seen and heard so that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. ⁴We are writing these things so that our joy may be complete." (1 John 1:3-4) Abiding in Christ does not mean snoozing in Christ. We are saved *for a reason*.

I'll use our youth group as an example. We have a solid core of youth members who are very active. We enjoy spending time together. We have shared jokes and rituals, and sometimes even I can't keep track of them all. Our task now is to invite more people in to our group so that they may come to know God. Welcoming new people takes work: you have to be persistent, generous, and willing to share. It means we have to go out of our way and often our comfort zone to make others feel welcome. It's tempting to stay in the shelter of our holy huddle, but the young people of Carson City need to know Christ and be reconciled to God.

I have a challenge for us. Bruce's benediction contains this line: "Christ who indwells us has something He wants to do through us where we are." How hard do we look for that "something" that Christ wants to do through us? If we want to love the Lord our God with all our heart, and with all our soul, and with all our strength, and with all our mind, let's search for that "something." Wherever we go, let's ask ourselves if Christ could use us to invite people into His fellowship and work passionately to deliver that invitation in whatever shape it may take. NOTES FROM THE MUSIC ROOM -

Worth-ship -

No, that's not a typo, but one definition of the English word "worship". Here's another: Mercy -- "a disposition or inclination to forgive and to be kind." You may be thinking, ok, how does this work together and what does all this have to do with me?

Well the two are connected by God. It is in God's nature to have mercy on us and to forgive us. Because of this mercy which is God's "default", we can boldly approach His throne in worship. But only He alone is worthy of worship. What other god loves sinners? Even when they sin? What other god would allow himself to be crucified for all in order to create a way back into his presence?

As I mentioned in my last article, I've been reading Buddy Owens's short book called "The Way of the Worshiper" (©2002, 2004, published by Purpose Driven Publishing). In the book, Buddy explains the "whys" and "hows" of worship. He relates it to his own experiences as a dad, teacher, pastor, and child of God. Its an easy read and I highly recommend it.

Buddy asks the question: "What's God worth to you?" He points out that our hunger for God is actually Godgiven. Everything we do for God is in response to what God has done for us. We even breathe because He gives us breath. How about this -- we are holy because God gives us holiness. We do not earn it by being a servant to God, we do not repent in order to earn forgiveness, we do not serve Him to become His child. He already loves us as His child, as He loves every other person He has placed on this earth. So with that in mind, as regards worship, let us not come to see if God "shows up" -- remember He is already here (in our lives, in our church, in our moment by moment days) -- we just need to see through the God-lens, or His eyes. May WE "show up" to engage with God!

Introducing GraceWorks. Others have called it "The Church has left the Building!" This is a Sunday when area churches show God's love through *providing* services, rather than *going to* services. It is an event that has been going on in several other communities across the US, involving thousands of people on a given Sunday. The First Presbyterian Church started it here in Carson City two years ago; last year The Door to The Way, an Hispanic church, joined them. Over 150 people participated. This year the First United Methodist Church and the Fountainhead Four Square Church will be joining the effort.

You can volunteer to provide labor, time, music or just a personal touch. These projects will be done in the community, on Sunday, June 2, 2013.

Examples of projects, among others, from which volunteers can choose:

- Linear Park and Governors' Field clean up and painting sheds and curbs
- Conducting music and worship at Carson Plaza and other Assisted Living Centers
- Do Drop In, a day center for homeless with disabilities repair work
- Planting flowers at the Senior Center
- Doing gardening at Fremont Elementary School
- Preparing meal bags for "Stop Hunger Now" or Blessing Bags for the homeless
- Helping people with home repair
- Food for Thought cleaning and organizing
- Children's Museum repair work some can be done by families
- Community Pregnancy Center, 222 E. Washington St.
- Small Blessings Preschool make preparations for playground upgrade
- A project at FISH
- Greenhouse at Carson High School following a plant sale the previous day, distribute remaining plants and clean up

As worshipers exit a local church sanctuary, the sign over the door says, "You are now entering the mission field." What better way to show God's love than by helping those in need right here at home! To volunteer, sign-up sheets will be available each Sunday in May, in the narthex.
