From the Pastor's Workshop

### "ON LEADING AND BEING LED"

We are in a season of seeking a new shepherd and of calling elders and deacons to the role of leadership in

the body of Christ. Your search team is very busy and doing a fine job reviewing applications and interviewing candidates. Please keep them in your prayers. And the *Nominating Commission* headed by elder Alan Jones needs your prayerful support as you consider serving or nominating someone to serve in the vital role of elder or deacon. This will be particularly important as a new pastor will need the support of faithful leaders as new territory is engaged.

A wise man once wrote, "Leadership is an art". I know how right he is because I have learned the most about being a leader by being led. And I have been my best as a leader as I am continually learning to be led. It is the journey that is always. Learning to lead is a process that never ends.



Who has led you best? Why do you think he or she was such a good leader? I know my best leaders; the ones who led me best and taught the most about leading were those who I know loved me, really loved me, enough to challenge me, to correct me, but to never let me go as they encouraged me and gave me heart to accomplish what it was that I was called to do.

THAT is the leadership that was best seen in Jesus. He inspired and instilled confidence that engendered implicit trust. I'm sure it was because he was charismatic, but not in a rock star way. Rather people followed Jesus because they knew he loved them. That will be the pastor, (which means "shepherd") that God sends us. And this needs to be the key in the elder and deacons who will lead here. They need to know our flock and love them. Jesus said, "I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me."

To lead well and to be led is to know our Shepherd Jesus; to hear him call our name because he loves us. It means knowing the names and the lives of those God has called us to lead. It is to love them with a love that desires to truly care for those entrusted to us.

I love you and I am so grateful for the opportunity to be a shepherd in this setting. I am humbled by the calling. It is why I try so hard to know your names and to know your story. My prayer is that we will continue to grow as God's servant shepherds in seeking to know and care for God's flock the way Jesus showed us; by being willing to lay down our lives and agendas and time and resources to show what it really means to belong to him. Jesus did this for us and showed us how to lead by being led.


### THE KING'S KIDS

### SONGS OF LIFE -


Psalm 96 says "Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth, Sing to the Lord, praise his name; proclaim his salvation day after day (vss 1-2).

The books we find directly in the center of the Bible (no accident) are those of the Psalms. This is the hymn book of Jesus. I recently had the opportunity to hear from a number of experts on the Psalms at the Sing! Conference in Nashville, TN and I thank you, the congregation, for making that possible!

The experts make a great case for studying the five books that make up the collection called Psalms. Of

particular note to me are those that call upon us all to sing to the Lord. You'll note that Psalm 96 states we are to sing to the Lord a "new song". Later on in Psalm 98 it talks about glorifying the Lord with "lyre and the sound of melody" and "trumpets and the sound of the horn" In Psalm 150 we are challenged to "Praise him with trumpet sound; praise him with lute and harp! Praise him with tambourine and dance; praise him with strings and pipe! Praise him with sounding cymbals;" (even loud, crashing cymbals — you drummers!).

But even more than singing to the Lord, we may pray to the Lord in the words He has given us as we learn the Psalms. As with all of scripture, God's word to us in the Psalms is good for teaching and reproof, it shows us how to handle ourselves in His presence, and in the larger congregation of believers. Psalms is filled with references to Jesus, and it teaches us how best to surrender our lives to God. King David was a prolific writer of Psalms as well as others. In Psalm 51, we see how he interacts after being called out by Nathan. A reading of Psalm 51 will reveal the contrite spirit with which David asks for God to forgive him. There are psalms of praise, psalms of lament, psalms of repentance and psalms of gratitude. These are the songs of life.



Martin Luther, the reformer said "The Psalter (Psalms) ought to be a dear and beloved book." He added, "Most beautifully and briefly it embraces everything in the Bible." He even once called the Psalms a "short Bible".

One of the keynote speakers for Sing!, Ligon Duncan, (Chancellor / CEO of Reformed Theological Seminary), cites several reasons that the Psalms are vital for the 21st Century church. I plan to explore these reasons in the next few newsletters. Duncan's first reason is that "the Psalms are the best Christian devotional book ever written". The Bible commentator, Matthew Henry once said that "no one book of Scripture is more helpful to the devotions of the saints than the Psalms. When we sing them it gets their devotional truth into our hearts." In addition, often when we leave worship, we are humming a tune. Songs reach down deeply into us and stay with us. By singing Psalms, we will more easily memorize God's Word.

Over the next several months, we will learn some new settings of the Psalms in worship. Stay connected with worship at FPC to learn some exciting new songs, as we also strengthen our spiritual muscles and allow the Word of God to sink into our souls.

I am excited for the possibilities this brings to renew our worship of God.

join us if you are able!




