## From the Pastor's Desk

#### Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

We celebrate Pentecost on June 9 this year. Most people remember Pentecost by wearing red and thinking about the "divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them." (Acts 2:3) We think of it as a powerful manifestation of the Holy Spirit among believers. All that is accurate. Where I would like to point your attention, however, is to what happened: they spoke in many languages – yes, that is incredible to contemplate – about "God's deeds of power."

God's deeds of power.

As we prepare to celebrate and give thanks to God for the ministry Bruce and Nancy have had with this congregation, I encourage you to think about what you have seen God do in and through their faithfulness and obedience. For example, Bruce and I were talking about preaching the other day. We both have had the experience of people thanking us for something we said during the sermon – and being confident that we said nothing close to what the person heard. It is such an amazing thing to realize that the Spirit God is at work in the midst of the proclamation of the gospel to meet people where they are. Although I have not seen literal tongues of fire over those people who have been touched, I am confident that the same Holy Spirit is at work. Now, let me ask you this: where and how have you seen God minister through Bruce and Nancy? It could have been something personal with you or with someone else, or more broadly with the congregation. I encourage you to take a few moments in the next weeks to dwell on this question. Make a note of what comes to mind so that you can share that with them – how they have been used to bring glory to God.


Think about where God has touched your life. What are the mountaintop moments you have had? Where have you been – minding your own business – when all of a sudden God showed up, intervened, stopped you short, or disrupted your plans? How did you react? What happened next? Now, let me ask you this: when was the last time you told someone else about God's deeds of power in your life?

Consider how God has touched the lives of people you have known. As I spend time with you, I am impressed by the ways God has met you where you are, God has opened doors for you, God has carried you through trials, and how God has done marvelous deeds of power among you. It is incredibly encouraging to me to hear these things. It strengthens my faith to know that you all share the grace that we have received from God in Jesus Christ. Now, let me ask you this: have you asked others about where and how God has touched their lives with deeds of power? You do not have to use those specific words, but it is important to ask the question. You need to hear and they need to tell.

For me, God changed my life in the midst of a confirmation class when I was in 9<sup>th</sup> grade. There was no dramatic event. I was sitting there minding my own business, going through the process that everyone went through. I had grown up in the church. My parents were insistent that we always go to church. The natural expectation was that I would join the church. But as the class sessions were dwindling down and the time was coming that I would face the session to be examined for membership, I had an epiphany. Literally, I was overwhelmed with the sense that I should not and could not join the church unless I could honestly and sincerely profess Jesus Christ as my Lord and Savior. Oh. I was confident that I knew the right answers and could respond to the session's questions, but this was different. God made it clear to me that knowing the right (continues next page)

stuff was not what He sought; what God sought was me. I did not see a literal tongue of fire; but there is no question in my mind that it was God's Holy Spirit convicting me of my sinfulness and claiming me as Christ's own.

Friends, the true miracle of Pentecost was how amazed people were when disciples "spoke about God's deeds and power." In the telling, God's Holy Spirit moved and convicted hearts. It happened then and it still happens today.

# Sing!

Colossians 3: 16-17 — "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. (ESV)

Have you ever wondered why humans sing? There are some everyday, practical reasons to sing that include the effects that singing has on the brain: oxytocin increases; cortisol decreases in the body, and this may be a remedy to loneliness, stress and even depression. Thus, research has uncovered what God built into us. The Great Physician, knew that singing would benefit us as well as please Him. When you sing in a group, such as a choir or congregation, there is a sense of social connectedness and in our case as Christians, a sense of being connected to our God, the global Church and one another.

Some may shy away from singing in the congregation, and might rather sing in the shower, in the car, or while running a vacuum, or other noisy equipment. Some may also not want to sing at all. Music is a "gift of God", but not just to those that excel in making it. It has great power for those who listen to it, sing it, perform it and join in writing it. There are those who say, "Well, I don't have a voice, or I can't sing." God takes pleasure in hearing your voice among the worshippers, even if you think you can't sing! In the Scriptures, God commands His people to sing. It is one of the most frequently repeated commands. God is very interested that we sing to Him, as well as what we sing to Him.

The Reformers were keen to have God's words be set to music for their worship services. Calvin recognized that the power of music is for "recreating man and giving him pleasure." He also noted that the songs need to be worthy of the God whom they praise, and therefore recommended that the words of the song be God's own. Regarding the tunes, he stated they should have weight and majesty, and not like those one would use to "entertain at table."

There are three sections to this Colossians passage that I note: (Part 1) "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom." (Part 2) "...singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God." (Part 3) "And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him."

By singing the Psalms, we can better learn scripture. When singing in the congregation, we are teaching and witnessing to each other in the wisdom of God's words. We are also ministering to each other by raising up the Lord Jesus Christ through our deeds - specifically in this case by singing with and to each other, the truths of Scripture.

Come, join in the praise of our God, using psalms, hymns and spiritual songs as we grow together in God's Word.
