I recently finished a biography of Bob Pierce called "This One Thing I Do" by Franklin Graham. Bob Pierce was the founder of World Vision and also Samaritan's Purse. He was a man who put his faith in action. One of his mantras was this: "Let my heart be broken by the things that break the heart of God."
