FROM YOUR PASTOR'S DESK



My earliest memory of politics was turning on the TV to watch cartoons only to discover with great disappointment that the Watergate hearings had preempted Bugs Bunny! Politics have always been contentious, and this election season is no exception. I heard recently of a pastor who talked about the party system. He noted that we have the party of the donkey, the party of the elephant and then there is the party of the Lamb. John the Baptist identified the leader of this party as Jesus when he said "Behold the lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world." (John 1:29) Jesus did not lead a political party, but He did bring about a spiritual revolution that frees His people from sin and death.

As Christians we are called to participate in the political process. Romans 13:7 says "Pay to all what is owed to them: taxes to whom taxes are owed, revenue to whom revenue is owed, respect to whom respect is owed, honor to whom honor is owed." This sounds a lot like what Jesus said "to render to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's." (Mark 12:17) What do we owe to our politicians? They deserve our respect, our support through paying of taxes, our compliance as far as our conscience will allow and an acknowledgment that they are there as "servants of God." (see Romans 13:4) And what do we owe God? He deserves our worship, our trust, our love. We know that our political system is important, but ultimately it cannot save us. There is only One who is the Savior of the world, the Lamb of God.

We have a God-given civic responsibility to pray and vote according to how the Holy Spirit leads us. But as we engage in politics it is critical that followers of Jesus do so with a spirit of love. Romans 13:8 emphasizes this point: "Owe no one anything, except to love each other, for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law." The church is called to set a different tone in the middle of all the political rancor. We are to love our neighbors as Christ loves us, even if their votes do not match ours. I know that more than anything I want to be identified as being a part of the party of the Lamb, the party that loves well!



And of course, we are delighted to simply and substantively invite, encourage, and equip people to see, savor, and serve Jesus Christ as the Author and Perfector of their faith through the Sunday worship gatherings and as we meet together in each other's homes throughout the week!
