What needs to change? Ezra and Acts

Nehemiah was broken over hearing the conditions of God's people and His city. (v 4) Nehemiah was some 600-700 miles away and hearing what was going on..

- 1. He sat down and wept
- 2. He mourned several days
- 3. He fasted over the conditions in Jerusalem
- 4. He prayed!
 - a. He focused on God (v 5-6a)
 - i. Acknowledged God's greatness and awesomeness
 - Acknowledged God's faithfulness and love to those who love and obey Him
 - Asked for God's ear to be attentive and His eyes open to the prayer of His servant
 - b. He understood the seriousness of sin, which led him to confess his own as well as the sin of all of Israel (6b-7)
 - i. Confess the sins of self, father's house and all Israel
 - ii. Confess the wickedness of people toward God
 - iii. Confess the disobedience of the commands, decrees and laws given to Moses
 - c. Nehemiah went back to Scripture (v 8-9) Deut. 4, 28 and 30.
 - You cannot separate God's Word from Prayer
 It is impossible to develop powerful biblical praying
 without joining your prayers to the promises of God's
 Word (Dr Frizzell)

There are two things from Scripture that Nehemiah acknowledges:

- ii. God is attentive to judge sin
- iii. God is attentive to redeem those who repent
- d. Finally, Nehemiah only asks as one who is dedicated to the reverence of God's name. (v11)

Our lives are to bring Glory to God and to result in His name being praised throughout the whole earth. John Piper: Far above the glory of God most people value painfree lives. For most people love is whatever puts human value and human well-being at the center. (When it should be God's glory!)




