# Messengers

## Thoughts

1 After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them two by two ahead of him to every town and place where he was about to go. 2 He told them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore...

### Luke 10:1-16

Luke 10 deals with 3 levels of Christianity which are helpful in answering the question, "What does a Christian do?" In the coming weeks we'll look at the second and third things, being neighbors and worshipers. This week's verses handle the idea of being ambassadors or messengers. appoints his disciples to go out and says in verse 16, "Whoever listens to you listens to me; whoever rejects you rejects me; but whoever rejects me rejects Him who sent me." What a remarkable endorsement and mission! Taken at face value, it sort of feels like we can simply go out and proclaim the good news and people either accept or reject. But modern life is more complex than this, is it not? Is there also perhaps a question of posture we should be asking ourselves? Namely, if we are truly representing God, how are we to act?
