Survey of the Latter WritingsSyllabus

Overview

The Writings stretch from Ruth to Chronicles. These twelve books compose the third part of Jesus' Bible. Within the Writings, there are the former (first) and latter (second) Writings.

In this class, we'll consider the structure and main theme(s) of the Latter Writings: Daniel, Esther, Ezra-Nehemiah and 1-2 Chronicles. (NOTE: Due to scheduling issues, Lamentations is included in the first class. It's difficult to discern whether it's meant to be part of the former or latter prophets). The Writings focus on living with wisdom—how think and live as Yahweh's covenant people. The Latter Writings specifically deal with *how to live faithfully in exile*; Esther and Daniel are two examples for us.¹ In Ezra, Nehemiah and Chronicles we see how Israel's return fell short of their anticipated restoration; indeed, there's a sense in which the people are still in exile, awaiting a new and greater exodus!² In each class, we'll also focus on each book's unique contribution to Scripture. We'll study what it meant to the original readers ("them-then"), how it points to Jesus and what that means for "us-now." Each lesson will prepare you to make the most of your readings each week.
