

The Key Issues

2. Imminence:

- (1) An event is certain to happen
- (2) The time is unknown

Mark 13:32 "But of that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but the Father alone."

<u>James 5:8</u> "You too be patient; strengthen your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is near."

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Objections to Imminence Answered

1. Passages about Christ being "near" aren't significant because other events are described as "near" in the Bible yet were not imminent.

Example: <u>John 11:55</u> "Now the Passover of the Jews was near, and many went up to Jerusalem out of the country before the Passover to purify themselves."

Answer: Passover = known date (14th of Nisan) Christ's Parousia = unknown date (Mark 13:32)

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Objections to Imminence Answered

Israel had to be established as a nation prior to parousia of Christ.

Example: <u>Daniel 9:27</u> "And he will make a firm covenant with the many for one week, but in the middle of the week he will put a stop to sacrifice and grain offering; and on the wing of abominations will come one who makes desolate, even until a complete destruction, one that is decreed, is poured out on the one who makes desolate."

Answer: Rapture, rebellion, Antichrist makes covenant and establishes Israel - builds temple, seats himself...

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Objections to Imminence Answered

3. The Bible seems to teach that "the rebellion" and Antichrist must come prior to the day of the Lord.


2 Thess. 2:2-3 NRSV not to be quickly shaken in mind or alarmed, either by spirit or by word or by letter, as though from us, to the effect that the day of the Lord is already here. 3 Let no one deceive you in any way; for *that day will not come* unless the rebellion comes first and the lawless one is revealed, the one destined for destruction.

Objections to Imminence Answered

2 Thess. 2:3 Let no one deceive you in any way; for that day is not here unless the rebellion comes first and the lawless one is revealed, the one destined for destruction.

Option 1: Rebellion, Antichrist (Day of the Lord)

Option 2: (Rebellion, Antichrist.....)




Matthew 12:29; Mark 3:27; John 7:51 support option 2!

Objections to Imminence Answered


Mark 3:27 But no one can enter the strong man's house and plunder his property unless he first binds the strong man, and then he will plunder his house.

(First bind the strong man...





Objections to Imminence Answered John 7:51 "Our Law does not judge a man unless it first hears from him and knows what he is doing, does it?" (Hear defendant, judge, sentence...) Judicial Process 2 Thess. 2:3b ...or it is not here unless the rebellion comes first, and the man of lawlessness is revealed, the son of destruction...



Passages That Affirm Imminence

Revelation 1:1a The Revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave Him to show to His bond-servants, the things which must soon take place... (cf. Daniel 2:28 LXX).

Revelation 22:6 "...These words are faithful and true'; and the Lord, the God of the spirits of the prophets, sent His angel to show to His bond-servants the things which must soon take place."

Revelation 22:10 And he said to me, "Do not seal up the words of the prophecy of this book, for the time is near."

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Passages That Affirm Imminence

"I am coming quickly" Rev. 3:11; 16:15; 22:7, 12, 20

<u>Philippians 4:5</u> Let your gentle spirit be known to all men. The Lord is near.

 $\underline{1}$ Thessalonians $\underline{1:10}$ and to wait for His Son from heaven, whom He raised from the dead, that is Jesus, who rescues us from the wrath to come.

Imminence passages: (Cf. 1 Cor. 1:7; 4:5; 15:51-52; 16:22; Phil. 3:20; Titus 2:13; James 5:7-9; 1 John 2:28)

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
