Joshua was Moses' right-hand man. He went with him to the mountaintop to receive the Word of God. Upon descending and hearing the gross sounds of false worship and debauched behavior, he said to Moses, "There is a noise of war in the camp" (Exodus 32:17). His ears were tuned to his soul, facilitating clear discernment. God was training Joshua to take Moses' place in leading the children of Israel to possess their possessions. It would be a daunting task requiring a deep spiritually-minded man with a God-centered heart. Joshua was that kind of man.

The children of Israel were self-centered, stubborn, easily led astray, and worldly. They had physically left Egypt, but Egypt was still deeply woven into the warp and woof of their being. There was much to accomplish, and they must be led to accomplish it.

The day came when God called His servant Moses home. It was time for Joshua to change roles from being an assistant to a strong leader to being the strong leader himself. God had been preparing him for what He had prepared for him. The Word of the Lord came to him: "Moses my servant is dead; now therefore arise, go over this Jordan, thou, and all this people, unto the land which I do give to them, even to the children of Israel" (Joshua 1:2).

I serve in a church with a blessed history of godly pastors who preceded me. Several years ago the biographer of Dr. Lewis Drummond, who pastored here in the 1950s, was in our service. Afterwards I sat with him and reminisced about Dr. Drummond's fruitful ministry here. He went on to pastor other churches; teach at Spurgeon's College in London, England; wrote a biography on Spurgeon; and taught at Beeson School of Divinity. I was privileged to have known the Drummonds, and I was reminded of a quote by Elisabeth Elliot: "We are all dwarfs, but we see farther than the ancients, not because we are taller than they, but because we stand on their shoulders."

Joshua must have felt tiny upon learning of Moses' death and God's commission for him to take his place. No amount of training or preparation could take away the feeling of inadequacy. But, "in the calling is the enabling."

Then came the promise. With every call from God, there is an accompanying "I will." "As I was with Moses, so I will be with thee: I will not fail thee, nor

forsake thee" (Joshua 1:5).

A. W. Tozer wrote that "For all things, God is the great Antecedent. Because He is, we are and everything else is. He is that 'dread, unbeginning One,' self-caused, self-contained, and self-sufficient."

Tozer goes on to write: "In one unified glance He comprehends all things from everlasting, and the flutter of a seraph's wings a thousand ages hence is seen by Him now without moving His eyes."

"So Joshua let the people depart, every man unto his own inheritance. And it came to pass after these things, that Joshua the son of Nun, the servant of the Lord, died, being an hundred and ten years old" (Joshua 24:28-29).

Known for his evangelistic zeal and uncompromising commitment to the Word of God, Adrian Rogers was one of the greatest preachers, respected Bible teachers, and Christian leaders of our time. For over fifty years, he consistently presented the Good News of Jesus Christ with strong conviction, compassion, and integrity. Adrian Rogers was known for his unique ability to simplify profound truth so that it can be applied to everyday life.

He was a devoted family man—husband to his childhood sweetheart, Joyce, father to four children, grandfather to nine, and great-grandfather to six. Of all his accomplishments, Dr. Rogers often said his greatest joy centered in his relationship to Jesus Christ, his wife and family, and the church he pastored.

Dr. Rogers pastored the Bellevue Baptist Church in Memphis, Tennessee, until his retirement in 2005. And Adrian Rogers was a leader in his denomination, serving three terms as president of the Southern Baptist Convention.

God's blessing on Dr. Rogers' ministry became even more evident with the birth of *Love Worth Finding Ministries* in 1987. The 30-minute daily radio broadcasts first aired on WGIB in 1986, along with just a handful of stations, before the program was syndicated nationally. The weekly *Love Worth Finding* television program is seen on WAY Television. Today LWF is broadcast on over 2,500 radio stations and translators in English and Spanish. In addition to the radio and television programs, LWF offers books, videos, CDs and other resources produced to encourage and strengthen the listener's daily walk with Jesus Christ.

Dr. Rogers stated, "I believe God wants us to proclaim the message of salvation in the power of the Holy Spirit by every means possible. That commitment at *Love Worth Finding* has not changed since the Lord called Dr. Rogers home in 2005.

Dr. Roger's messages of "Come To Jesus" are still reaching around the world and continue to be used by God to mend broken lives, save marriages, and help men and women to hear the good news of the gospel in many parts of the world through radio and television and the internet [www.lwf.org.]
