

Right Answer or Right Heart?

When it comes to relationships, which would your friend desire to receive from you - a right answer or a right heart? Quick and correct information or continuing to walk beside them even when you don't know what to say?

Of course, many friends would say they desire both – and that's often unrealistic. (See *RPOJ* day 39 "Forget the ideal, go for the real.") We never want to give wrong information to any of our friends, but neither do we want to quip answers when our companions really desire our heart. (See Relationship Principle of Jesus #3, "Communicate from the Heart." Even more so, our Heavenly Father desires right hearts over right answers. Having both is even better. Consider this account from **story-teller Philip Gully**.

PRAY that you and all participants grow in your relationship skills. Pray especially that actual relationships are deepened both with God and relatives through our practice of the Lord's teachings.

I was singing in an Easter choir once, and a man asked me why the song said Jesus died on a tree. I was so eager to impress, I gave him a long seminary-type answer about crucifixion methods in first-century Palestine. He listened to me go on, then said, "Oh, I just thought maybe they used the word 'tree' because it rhymed."

Gulley goes on to write: A lot of folks think closeness to God means knowing all the right answers. But I don't agree. I think closeness to God begins the night we toss and turn in bed, realizing we don't know it all. Look at the Bible. Some of its finest saints were long on questions: Job on his ash heap, the disciples asking Jesus to teach them to pray, Nicodemus grilling Jesus late into the night, even Jesus on the cross.

Having spent much of my life showing off my smarts, I nearly choke on the words, "I don't know." Still, I suspect those words might be the kingdom keys. What it boils down to is that God doesn't care whether or not we have right answers. Just right hearts. (*Front Porch Tales* by Philip Gulley, p. 81)

The One who makes our hearts right is ready for you to come to Him again today. Yes, Jesus, take hold of my heart and keep it right with you, especially when I don't know how to answer.

Reformation Rememberings

Martin Luther on Relationships

A Christian does not live for himself but in Christ and his neighbor. In Christ he lives through faith, in his neighbor through love. By faith he rises above himself into God; thence he again descends beneath himself by love into his neighbor. Yet he constantly abides in God and in divine love. *(Martin Luther, Treatise on Christian Liberty, 1520)*

Do you ever feel like giving up on relationships?

A Christian should not go backward and withdraw his hand but continue loving so that his love may be a divine, free, constant love, aye, even a love wasted on people and therefore a benefaction thrown away. A Christian should not speak as the world does: I have given and done you so much good, and you repay me as a knave and scoundrel. Therefore, I do not intend to give you a single penny in the future, nor would I help you if I could save you from death by stirring a finger. Rather a Christian must turn the leaf and say: I have served you and have done good to you according to my ability, and you repay me badly so that I gain nothing but ingratitude by my friendly heart and benefaction. Well, this shall not stop me; your wickedness and ingratitude shall not be so bad that my love cannot rise above them, though one should, at the same time rebuke what is to be rebuked.... However, this finds no response in man's heart. For love such as this is not natural attainment: it is not a plant that grows in our gardens. On the contrary, that man is able to give affection for affliction and continue to do nothing but good in return for nothing but knavery and wickedness is a gift of the Holy Spirit. *(Martin Luther in a sermon on 1 John 4:16-21, 1532)*

The Legacy of John Ylvisaker by Nick Klemetson

One of the great joys of my life was getting to know John Ylvisaker, a lifelong church and folk musician. Before he passed away in 2017, he was one of the most prolific songwriters in church music today, composing hundreds of texts, tunes, and arrangements. He is perhaps best known for his hymn which traces a life from baptism to death, "I Was There to Hear Your Boring Cry."

John spent his entire life sharing his music with countless people all over the world and has enriched millions of lives through God's amazing grace, and that's good news that needs to be shared and remembered. To show the true impact that John's music has had on our society, we need to look at the context for its importance.

For as long as both church and society have existed, there have been disputes between members of those churches and those societies. As can often happen during times of societal turmoil, cultural unrest can give way to positive changes in our society. Think of the advancements that have been born from times of stress in our culture. In the church, 500 years ago, Martin Luther made some shocking and eventually, revolutionary statements which led to the Protestant Reformation. It created a great deal of unrest in the church, but to Luther and his supporters, it certainly wasn't wrong; the outcome was to create an active role for the congregation. They sang together. Martin Luther would frequently take tunes he heard in the pub and set them to sacred texts because people were familiar with these tunes and were able to sing them immediately, in their own language. This created a more worshipful experience with active worship and active worshipers who grew closer to God and each other.

Inspired by folk singer, Pete Seeger's ability to connect with audiences in such a way that the entire audience would rise up and sing together, John would ask himself the question, "Why couldn't worship be like this?" John made it his vocation in life to bring the accessible folk style that was so conducive to community song and fuse it with the words and stories of God's church. This is what I strive to do with every song I pick and every way I play it, and it's what John worked to do for his entire career and what his music will continue to do for as long as we worship together.

John Ylvisaker's music keeps us focused on this goal of God-centered worship. His biblically oriented songs illuminate the Gospel. Worship is many things to many people but it must center on God, glorify Christ, involve the people of the church, communicate the truth of the Bible, encourage faith and promise redemption. John Ylvisaker's music enables us to do that, and that is very good news.



Charitable IRA Distributions

Individual Retirement Account (IRA) owners aged 70 ½ or older are eligible to make qualified distributions directly to a charitable organization. The benefits of making a direct Qualified Charitable Distribution from an IRA include:

- The contribution results in a reduction of adjusted gross income (AGI). A number of tax calculations are based on AGI, such as:
 - ◊ AGI is used in determining the how much of Social Security income is taxable, with a maximum of 85%. Therefore, making a direct contribution makes it less likely that Social Security benefits will be taxable.
 - ◊ Medical expense deductions are limited to amounts in excess of 10% of AGI in 2019. By lowering this threshold by reducing AGI, more medical expenses become deductible for those that itemize deductions.
 - ◊ The Net Investment Income Tax of 3.8% applies once AGI reaches certain thresholds for single (\$200k) and married (\$250k) filers. Lowering AGI could reduce or eliminate this tax on investment income.
 - ◊ Medicare premiums are based on AGI, so the reduction in could result in lower insurance costs.
- The contribution allows taxpayers who use the standard deduction to reduce taxable income.
- The charitable amount counts toward the individual's required minimum distribution (RMD) for the year, as calculated annually based on age and account balances.

The contribution must be made directly from the IRA trustee to the charitable organization (the funds cannot be received by the account owner).

Grace Lutheran School has participated in a national program for assistance for private schools in addressing school preparedness for dealing with the effects of COVID. The EANS grant provides the school money to help in two areas: to purchase cleaning, sanitizing, and other items for preventing the spread of COVID, and to provide technology for use in the school to help bridge learning gaps caused by COVID outbreaks, as well as to assist in distance learning when quarantining is necessary.

Grace has been using these funds to help offset the costs of cleaning and sanitizing equipment, but it has also been using a substantial portion of the funds on technology. Teacher laptops have been purchased, in addition to the docking stations which allow the laptops to communicate to projectors and interactive whiteboards. The elementary grades have each been equipped with an iPad cart for use in the classroom. Additional iPad carts are in the process of being ordered so that each class has access to a cart as needed. The Middle school students have all received the newer model of the laptops that they are using. Various equipment has been purchased to ensure that each of the classrooms has the up-to-date versions of the media projectors, sound system, document cameras (in the lower grades), and interactive whiteboard equipment. The grant has truly been a blessing, especially in helping to meet the needs of the school in terms of technology!

Mrs. K and the students at Grace have spent the first month of school getting to know each other through name games and other music activities that incorporate singing, movement, and instruments. The youngest grade levels are focusing on developing their singing voices, while the upper elementary focus on rhythm and listening skills. In middle school, students are applying skills and knowledge they learned in elementary school to listen to and analyze music, as well as creating their own compositions in cooperative groups.
