

Reaching the Unreachable

In YWAM, we are committed to the Great Commission- to go into all the world and preach the Gospel. This is why we went to the Silent circle- a region in Mexico where the population of Christians is very small. The history of Mexico is predominantly Catholic. Since the Spaniards settled here, people have devotedly worshiped the Saints, and it is sad to see how the churches here are still committed to that.

During our trip, we trained 21 youth to do dramas and dances, as a way to share their faith. We shared the Gospel through the arts in Calera, Zacatecas, Mexico, and we presented the message of salvation for the people who came near. Two people received Jesus as a result!



We also made a trip to Madera, Mexico, we went to minister to an indigenous people group called the Pimas. They do not have a Bible in their own language. We traveled 10 hours from Juarez- 4 ½ of those hours were purely in the mountains, where only off road vehicles can drive. We went with the intention of bringing pantry

items and solar radios that contain 40 Bible stories. These stories allow the interpreters to translate the stories into their written language.

Nowadays, only the oldest villagers speak the native language, as it has been dying, and they are working to revive it. There is no church in the village, but it struck me that, regardless of what they lack, the majority of these people have become familiar with Jesus through dreams. They are hungry for



the Word of God. Let's pray that God establishes a church there! It's been 15 years since a Catholic church leader visited their town. I will be going back in August to have another visit and to continue sharing the Good news of salvation.
