Baptism - as a NOUN - **6x in Acts** - (**Baptisma - tos**) - It refers only to Johns Baptism as a subject of discussion - Acts 1:22; 10:37; 13:24; 18:25; **19:3-4**

Baptism as VERB

1st Baptizo 3x (Subject declaring what He is doing) “**I Baptize You**”

P-1-A 1s A great place for a formula...In the name of... - Not once in The Book of Acts - Matt 3:11/Luke 3:16/John 1:26

2nd Verb - Baptistheto used 1x - (You **be** baptized) (Emp) **A M P** - 3s Acts 2:38

3rd Verb Baptizei - 3x (What is said about what the subject will do) “**He will baptize You:** F-1- A 3s

A great place for a formula... In the name of... - Not once in the Book of Acts - Matt 3:11/Mark 1:8/Luke 3:16 - John describing the Baptism of Christ - Holy Ghost-Fire)

4th Verb Baptisthenei - 11x (1x) in Acts (what will or should happen) “**I am- (to be) baptized**” A iF P

Matt 3:13-14/Mark 10:38/Acts 8:36 - Ethiopian 10:47-48? Peter What hinders (me/Them)?

5th Verb baptiseth - 4x 2x Acts (What will happen to you) - “**You shall be Baptized**” F-I-P 2p –
Matt 20:23/Mark 10:39/Acts 1:5; 11:16

6th Verb eBaptizō 5x - 2x - Acts (In the process of doing) “They were being Baptized” Imp - I - M/P
Acts 8:12; 18:8 - (Responding to the gospel) Gentiles - Samaritans - Greeks

There is no patent formula or expression given in the book of Acts regarding Baptism - whereby as an imperative we must say.

“We Baptize You in Jesus Name” In Jesus Name - expresses the authorization to practice the ordinance of Baptism.

The Formula was given by the one who has authorized the ordinance. Matt 18:18-20

6. Examples - of *the variation* - of *the authority of His name* used regarding baptism

Acts 2:38 - “Jesus Christ” Acts 8:16 - “The Lord Jesus” (vs 12) identity/ authority - Acts 9:37-38 (No - in the name of...)

Acts 9:17-18 - (No formula Or expression) 22:16 Christ not mentioned

Acts 11:48 (“In the name of the Lord” Jesus is not mentioned) -

Acts 16:15, 31-32 - Lydia/The Jailer - (No mention) Why? A formula was not the authors point!
