Sermon Title: “Substitute Death For Life”

Topic: “Substitution” Part 2

Text: John 19:28-42

A) Christ’s work was finished and completed; nothing needed nor to be added.

1. On the tree, The Jews were more concerned about the sabbath day than the Messiah! vs 31
2. 2 Tim 3:5 (form, act or give appearance) Matt 15:8/Is 29:13 (vain worship)
3. More concerned with Law Keeping than the one who accomplished Law- Deut 21:22-23/Romans 10:4
4. Providence and purpose, no broken legs, blood and water. Fulfilled scripture and signified our justification and sanctification 1 Cor. 1:30 - vs 33-37

B) All done to fulfill scripture.

Ex12:46/Ps 34:20/Zech 12:10/Rev. 1:7

“CHRIST IN CONNECTION WITH THE LAW.” The law is that which, as sinners, we have above all things cause to dread; for the sting of death is sin, and the strength of sin is the law. Towards us the law darts forth devouring flames, for it condemns us, and in solemn terms appoints us a place among the accursed, as it is written, "Cursed is every one that continueth not in all things that are written in the book of the law to do them." (Spurgeon) Deut 27:26/Gal 3:10

C) An honorable, religious, and a secret disciple. Our courage found in love. (v 38)

1. Joseph of Arimathea found grace in the eyes of God
Gen 6:8/Jer 1:5/Eph-2
2. From form to power, religious to relationship, a new creature
2 Tim 3:5/2 Cor 5:17 (New) καινή- kaine = New or fresh (Creature) κτίσις - ktisis = Creation
3. Finding our strength in Christ, enough is enough!

“Now what we see today in Proverbs 28:1 is a powerful confirmation of that truth. It says, "The wicked flee when no one is pursuing, but the righteous are bold as a lion." In other words, there is a correlation between wickedness and fear on the one hand, and righteousness and courage on the other hand. And the gospel is a message about how wicked people can get right with God through Jesus Christ so that they have a righteousness that makes them as bold as a lion.” John Piper
