



I. Repent to prepare your heart for hope (1:1-6).


"Evil Ways"

Way: The course of your life, the principles you use to help you make moral choices, your reasoning process, these reside in your heart. **Evil way**: stubborn refusal to obey God's word and following your own counsel.

Isa 55:7; Ps 32:8; 37:5, 7, 23, 34; Jer 3:17, 7:24

"Evil Deeds"

Deeds flow from evil ways. Deeds are what you do, the actual choices you make.

II. Learn to stand on the sure ground of God's promises (1:7-2:13).
