Interns will be given a job description structured around their skill sets, growth areas, and the current needs at GCC.

The PURPOSE of the Creative Arts internship is to train leaders for a life of ministry through discipleship and experience in a gospel-centered, intergenerational congregation.

Goals for the Internship

- Affirmation of calling to ministry
- Theological development
- Practical competency

It is our desire to see those interested in working in full-time ministry gain a better understanding of the reality of working on church staff. The internship is also a training ground for those who wish to learn the value of making ministry an everyday part of their life. It is not only for those who plan to go into vocational ministry, but may aid in discerning that calling.

RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Discipleship: Interns will be discipled by Creative Arts Director, and will be encouraged to develop a discipleship relationship with someone in their sphere of influence.

Outcome: Shepherding, leadership, equipping, counseling

2. Leadership: Interns will be given opportunities to lead in planning, implementation, and performance. Adult, youth, and children contexts will provide different opportunities for leadership and interaction with ministry leaders.

Outcome: Team work, planning, organization, and facilities coordination

- 3. Participation: Interns are expected to be Members or Associate Members at GCC and participate in a Home Group (travel and distance permitting). Interns should participate in Church-wide events (VBS, Day of Prayer, CU Move-In, etc), also travel and distance permitting.
- 4. Study: Interns will be given biblical and theological material to challenge and equip them spiritually. They will meet regularly with the Creative Arts Director to discuss.
- 5. Administration: Interns will be trained in all aspects of planning and event preparation. The intern will spend adequate time each week in planning and coordination for successful execution of upcoming worship experiences.

PERSONAL INVESTMENT

Interns will meet regularly with the Creative Arts Director. Scripture memorization, theological training, Bible study, and reading/discussing a topical book are all potential items for the meetings. Interns will also have the opportunity to take turns facilitating and leading discussion. Other GCC Elders may participate in this time and in discipleship generally.

DEVELOPMENT PLAN

Each intern will consider a plan for spiritual growth.

This may include practice of spiritual disciplines, regular accountability, or other methods as determined by the Pastor for Creative Arts after the application process.

SCHEDULE

12-month/Semester commitment (suggested)

Monday staff meetings, once or twice a month - 9am to 1pm (negotiable for travel/classes) Thursday rehearsals - 6pm to 8:30pm

HOUSING

All interns will need to find their own housing. We are willing to promote the need for housing among the GCC family, however, if an intern wishes/needs to relocate. 10-week interns coming from outside NC will have specific assistance in finding a host home or rental option as well as assistance in travel while at GCC.
