# The LORD Said to My Lord

Having offered one sacrifice for sins for all time, He sat down... waiting from that time onward. —Hebrews 10:12-13



## LORD'S DAY DEVOTION AND QUESTIONS

Sanctification is not an option for God's people, it is the will of God (1 Thessalonians 4:3); a divine decree. Some people hear this statement as meaning that sanctification is something that ought to happen to them 'auto-magically', without any effort on their part. They continue to live in obvious sin waiting for God to sanctify them. This lack of zeal for holiness has inclined sections of the church to separate God's sovereignty from sanctification. They reason that if believers are responsible for their own sanctification it will lead to greater zeal for holiness. But separating God's sovereignty from sanctification has arguably lead to a decline in holiness among God's people. Richard Phillips describes this situation saying:

Is it not instead the case that at this very moment when God's sovereignty is most strongly compromised and neglected, the church is stained by sin, shattered by division, and so weak that, far from shaping society, the church is instead being strongly reshaped by the world?

God's sovereign decree for our sanctification does not excuse us from striving after holiness; this ought to be clear by the many times in Scripture we are commanded to live in accordance with God's requirements and seek after holiness in all areas of life. Instead, knowing that our sanctification is sovereignly decreed by God ought to give us hope and encouragement that we will, despite our sin and corruption, through the power of the Holy Spirit, actually make progress in our sanctification.

- 1. Read Ephesians 1:3-4. How is God's sovereignty in our sanctification tied to our election? According to this passage, would it be correct to say that the purpose of our election is our sanctification?
- 2. Look up Romans 8:29. How does Paul connect our salvation to our sanctification? Notice that the context of this verse is Paul explaining the work of the Holy Spirit in the life of the believer. Does this verse encourage or discourage you to seek after holiness?
- 3. Look up 1 Thessalonians 4:1-2. How does Paul make it clear that his exhortations to holiness are not just his preference, but that believers are commanded by the Lord Jesus to seek after holiness?
- 4. How will a life devoted to grateful obedience to Jesus' commands be different from that of an unbeliever's? How will it be different from someone who is trying to earn God's favor through obedience?
- 5. How does God's sovereignty in sanctification remove any excuses you might have in striving after holiness? How does it positively encourage you to live obediently?
