According to a commonly shared story, Margaret Mead, the anthropologist, was asked by a student what she "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed citizens can change the world; indeed, it's the only thing that ever has." -Margaret Mead

thought was the earliest sign of a civilized society. There are many variations of the anecdote, but the general details are similar: To the student's surprise, she replied that the first sign of civilization is a healed human femur- the long bone that connects the hip to the knee.

Mead proceeded to explain, as the story goes, that wounded animals in the wild would be hunted and eaten before their broken bones could heal. Thus, a healed femur is a sign that a wounded person must have received help from others. Mead is said to have concluded, "Helping someone else through difficulty is where civilization starts."

While the wounds (brokenness) of people who experience homelessness aren't always visible, we know, intuitively, they are present in their lives. Sometimes, we see the clues of the pain and trauma, but many times we don't. Worse yet, we sometimes discount the fairly obvious signs as bad choices or intractable problems (substance abuse, mental illness, immorality). Worst of all, we have allowed some people to become invisible (homeless families), denying their existence with our willful blindness to their dilemma. Seemingly, we have lost hope in our ability to be civilized.

Solving homelessness is not an impossible task, it can be solved. Fourteen communities in the U.S. have reached "functional zero" for at least one population experiencing homelessness.

By December 31, 2030, we will ensure there isn't a single homeless child in Winter Haven. On that January 1st, we will celebrate how we became a civilized community! ♥

Accessory Dwelling Units Grant

We are excited to announce that our <u>Housing Partnership of Winter Haven</u> has partnered with <u>the City of Winter Haven</u> to offer a grant for creating additional affordable housing units. With this grant, homeowners can bring offline ADUs (accessory dwelling units), like garages, small apartments, etc., online and rent them at an affordable rate to families or individuals needing housing options.



The grant amounts awarded will be \$5,000 for one bedroom, \$10,000 for two bedrooms, and \$15,000 for three bedrooms. Homeowners interested in this grant can email Bee Gallison at bee@heart4wh.org, or 863.291.6270, for more information or an application.


Company Match Donations
