- 1. What is Paul's indictment of the church and false teachers in Galatia (vv. 8-10; Gal. 3:3)? How can seeking to save yourself by legalistic observance of the law be just as enslaving as an immoral pagan lifestyle?
- 2. What does Paul say is necessary for you to be a Christian (vs. 9; 1 Cor. 8:3)? How is God knowing you an antidote to your insecurity and the worship of false gods (1 Cor. 4:3-4; Gal. 1:10)?
- 3. Why does Paul want the Galatians to be like him (vs. 12a; Acts 26:28-29)? How is Paul's becoming like the Galatians a model for the way you witness to those who do not yet know Christ (vs. 12a; 1 Cor. 9:20-22)?
- 4. Why do you think the Galatians responded so well to Paul's suffering (vv. 12b-15)? How is the Galatians reaction to the truth a cautionary tale about being selective in your reading of New Testament doctrine (vs. 14; Matt. 10:40; Lk. 10:16; Jn. 13:20)?
- 5. Why were the false teachers making much of the Galatians (vv. 17-18)? How do you know when Christ is formed in you (vs. 19; Rom. 8:9-11; 2 Cor. 13:5)?
