Scripture Reading: Hebrews 10:1-10 (p. 1006)

¹ For since the law has but a shadow of the good things to come instead of the true form of these realities, it can never, by the same sacrifices that are continually offered every year, make perfect those who draw near. ² Otherwise, would they not have ceased to be offered, since the worshipers, having once been cleansed, would no longer have any consciousness of sins? ³ But in these sacrifices there is a reminder of sins every year. ⁴ For it is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins. ⁵ Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said, "Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body have you prepared for me; ⁶ in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no

pleasure. ⁷ Then I said, 'Behold, I have come to do your will, O God, as it is written of me in the scroll of the book.'" ⁸ When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), ⁹ then he added, "Behold, I have come to do your will." He does away with the first in order to establish the second. ¹⁰ And by that will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

God Speaks To Us

"Living in Line with the Gospel" Galatians 2:11-21 (p. 973) Barry Noll

¹¹ But when Cephas came to Antioch, I opposed him to his face, because he stood condemned. ¹² For before certain men came from James, he was eating with the Gentiles; but when they came he drew back and separated himself, fearing the circumcision party. ¹³ And the rest of the Jews acted hypocritically along with him, so that even Barnabas was led astray by their hypocrisy. ¹⁴ But when I saw that their conduct was not in step with the truth of the gospel, I said to Cephas before them all, "If you, though a Jew, live like a Gentile and not like a Jew, how can you force the Gentiles to live like Jews?"

¹⁵ We ourselves are Jews by birth and not Gentile sinners; ¹⁶ yet we know that a person is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ, so we also have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ and not by works of the law, because by works of the law no one will be justified.

¹⁷ But if, in our endeavor to be justified in Christ, we too were found to be sinners, is Christ then a servant of sin? Certainly not! ¹⁸ For if I rebuild what I tore down, I prove myself to be a transgressor. ¹⁹ For through the law I died to the law, so that I might live to God. ²⁰ I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. ²¹ I do not nullify the grace of God, for if righteousness were through the law, then Christ died for no purpose.

- 1. Why do people say that the church is filled with a bunch of hypocrites? How do you respond to such an accusation?
- 2. Why did Paul confront Peter in Antioch (vv. 11-14)? How do you specifically struggle to live in step with the truth of the gospel (vs. 14)?
- 3. What are different ways that you tried to justify yourself before God and others? Why can't religious and nonreligious performance justify you before God (vv. 15-16)?
- 4. How does a proper understanding of the gospel prevent you from falling into legalism on the one hand or licentiousness on the other hand (vv. 17-20)? In what ways does union with Christ a powerful resource in your battle with ongoing sin like pride, anger, lust, jealousy (vs. 20; Rom. 6:1-14; Col. 3:1-4)?
- 5. What did the Judaizers teach the Galatians about salvation that made them live as though Christ died for no purpose (vs. 21)? How does the reality of your inability to save yourself through your moral goodness or personal accomplishments make you more thankful for Christ and the cross (1 Tim. 1:12-17)?
