Word for Women

WEEK 1

“He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. For by Him all things were created that are in heaven and that are on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers. All things were created through Him and for Him.” Colossians 1:15

Day 1 - Read the above verse and list all the characteristics you see for Christ.

Day 2 - Think on the power that was required to create the world. Now compare that power to your problems you're dealing with today. Doesn't this give you a sense of security that God has the power to take care of you?

Day 3 - Think of the wisdom of God. When you look at creation, the wisdom to make this world work together is amazing! Therefore, He has the wisdom to take care of you.

Day 4 - Think of the sovereignty of God. He reigns over everything. Therefore, all that is going on in the world today is under His control. We may not understand what and why things are going as they are, but we can know that God knows.

Day 5 - Today, note everything you see in creation and praise Him. Write these things down so during this month you can review your observations.

WEEK 2

“He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of his love, in whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins.” Colossians 1:13-14

Day 1 - Begin to memorize this verse. Take one phrase per day and think through each word. Today Jesus delivered us from the power of darkness. What darkness did Jesus deliver you from? Thank Him for that deliverance.

Day 2 - Today, note where did we go when He delivered us? Thank Him today each hour for moving us into the kingdom of His love.

Day 3 - Write down the definition of “redemption.” Think on this word today. How did He redeem us? Through His blood on the cross. Thank Him for this work.

Day 4 - Today thank Jesus for His work and His forgiveness. Be specific about what He has forgiven you of.

Day 5 - Who can you tell today about Jesus and His redemptive work?

WEEK 3

“For it pleased the Father that in Him all the fullness should dwell, and by Him to reconcile all things to Himself, by Him, whether things on earth or things in heaven, having made peace through the blood of His cross.” Colossians 1:19

Day 1 - This verse is a little harder to memorize but it is a good one to have in your mind. Looking at the first phrase- Jesus was fully God. Think on what this means to you.

Day 2 - Jesus came to reconcile all things to Himself. He paid the penalty for our sins so we could be with Him. Isn't this amazing? Today praise God for this reconciliation each time you see a clock. When you see a clock, it can remind you of all the “times” you needed this reconciliation because your works would never do it.

Day 3 - He made peace for us through the blood of the cross. He suffered for us so we could have peace. Today, think on this each time you see something red.

Day 4 - Continue to memorize the verse and praise God for this reconciliation and forgiveness.

Day 5 - Find someone that needs this good news and share. Instead of giving a physical gift or in addition to a physical gift, give them the gift of the good news.

WEEK 4

“And Jesus said to him, “Today salvation has come to this house, because He also is a son of Abraham, for the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost.” Luke 19:9-10

Day 1 - Begin to memorize the above verse. This week I am challenging you to seek the lost and to spread the good news. Who in your life needs to hear it? Pray for God to show you the one person He wants you to share the Word of God.

Day 2 - Continue to memorize the verse and pray for God to show you how you can show love to the person He has shown you to share the gospel with. This act of love may open a door for you to share the good news with them.

Day 3 - Read Luke 19:1-10. What simple act of kindness did Jesus do that changed Zacchaeus' life?

Day 4 - Read verse 7 again. Have you ever let what others may think stop you from showing the lost the love of Christ? Pray and ask God to not let anything stop you from sharing His good news.

Day 5 - Jesus came to seek and save the lost. Consider how you once were lost. Now find someone to share Christ's love with today!
