## GENESIS 1

### Questions for adults to discuss:

Read through Genesis chapter one.

1. Why is it important to recognize God as our Creator?
2. In verse 3, God says “Let there be light.” Why do you think God started with creating light on the first day?
3. Throughout creation, God separates things: the light from the dark, the day from the night, etc. What does God call us to be separate from? What are some ways you can set yourself apart for Him this week?
4. What does it mean for us as people to bear the image of God?

### Questions to discuss with 6th-12th grade students:

1. What are some things that come to mind when you think of darkness? What about light?
2. How did God separate the darkness from the light? (Genesis 1:1-5)
3. How are we, as God's image bearers supposed to reflect Him? (Genesis 1:26-28)
4. How is Jesus the true image of God (Colossians 1:15), and what has He done to push back darkness?



### **Questions/Activities for birth-5th graders:**

#### **Genesis 1:3-5**

And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. And God saw that the light was good. And God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

#### **Questions:**

1. What did God create on the first day? (light)
2. How did He create the light? (He spoke and it came into existence)
3. What does the scripture say God saw? (He saw that the light was good)
4. God separated the light from \_\_\_\_\_? (darkness)

#### **Activities:**

If you have playdough or modeling clay, find enough for each family member to mold a small animal. You can also use building bricks to build animals. Gather together and have each person create a model of a living creature out of the bricks or playdough. When everyone finishes, let each person command their creation to become real. Make sure you point out that nothing happens when we try to speak something into existence. Talk about how only God has this incredible power. He is our Creator, and He alone created the light we talked about in today's sermon.
