PSALM 67

Questions for adults to discuss:

1. What would it mean for God's face to shine down on us?
2. How are the nations expressing their praise to God? What reason is given in verse 4 for their praise?
3. What does it mean that we would desire the nations fear God? (v. 7)
4. What is similar about the end of the Psalm (v. 7) and the beginning (v. 1)? How has God blessed you?
5. How would you share the gospel with someone who is open to listen? How about someone who is skeptical and doubting?
6. Who can you share the gospel with this week? Pray God would reveal the person and the opportunity to share.

Questions to discuss with 6th-12th grade students:

1. How do we see God's grace, blessing, and saving power most clearly in Jesus? Why should this lead people to praise Him? (v. 1-3)
2. What does it mean God judges the peoples with equity? Why is this good news? (v. 4)
3. How will God's saving power one day spread among all the nations and to the ends of the earth? (Read Matthew 28:18-20)
4. Who are some people in your life that you can tell about God's saving power?

Questions for birth-5th graders:

“May God be gracious to us and bless us and make His face to shine upon us, that your way be known on earth, your saving power among all nations.” Psalm 67:1-2

1. How is God’s name made known to all the nations?
2. How can we support people who are called to other places to share the gospel?
